## NEW U. S. CUSTOMS FEE STAMP FOUND

An unlisted variety of the Customs Fee Stamps has been submitted to Editor Eugene N. Costales for inclusion in Scott's U. S. Specialized Catalogue.

It is a 20c value (RL1) in red, rather than dull rose, and is perforated by what Scott terms "hyphen hole 7" instead of the normal 5½ roulette which was used for the life of the series which stretched over 30 years (1887-1918).

During that time the 20c denomination, which was used in huge quantities, must have gone into many printings. One or more of these, it is logical to assume, must have occurred during the Spanish American War period, when the bureau was using the slot perforation (see the battleships and the 1898 medicine stamps) and the strange part of this discovery is that other RL1's with the hyphen holes haven't turned up before this.

Why not check your copies. Perhaps it exists in other denominations!
