A PHILATELIC FRAUD

★ USED FOR 50CENT STAMP ★

My first encounter with the above-depicted surcharge took place approximately a year ago, when a photocopy showing portions of three documents bearing the beast was referred to me for an opinion. All three documents were apparently entries of merchandise through the port of Philadelphia, but a request to the owner for full copies of the documents elicited no response, precluding any conclusions concerning the nature of validity of the surcharge.

The above mentioned documents are as follows:

April 22, 1863 — 25c Insurance April 5, 1867 — 25c Certificate

December 20, 1867 — 5c Certificate (vert. strip of 4) and

15c Inland Exchange (2 singles)

Recently, through the courtesy of Brian Bleckwenn, such a document was obtained for my collection, bearing a "surcharged" 25c Certificate stamp. This document is indeed an Entry of Merchandise from Philadelphia, dated May 12, 1870, and a cursory examination of this Entry reveals the "provisional surcharge" to be naught but a bald-faced FRAUD!

The Internal Revenue law of the time prescribed that Entries of Goods (or, if you will, Entries of Merchandise) be subject to stamp taxes as follows:

"... not exceeding one hundred dollars in value, twenty-five cents. Exceeding one hundred and not exceeding five hundred dollars in value, fifty cents. Exceeding five hundred dollars in value, one dollar."

The entry in question covers:

"One Barrel Brown Sugar . . . valued @ \$10.00

- ... Three Barrels Molasses .. valued @ \$18.00
- . . . Four dozen boxes Guava Jelly . . valued @ \$4.00
- ... 2 Demijohns Ogoden Wine .. valued @ \$5.00
- ... One Case Gin .. valued @ \$8.50 . . "

The total value of the entry is thus \$45.50, or "not exceeding one hundred

dollars," and the 25c stamp was sufficient to discharge the obligation of the importer to the Internal Revenue Service, without resorting to the employment of a surcharge.

The problem of the origin of this handstamp naturally arises, so it is fitting that we examine the circumstances involved, answering these questions:

- 1) Was such a surcharge authorized by law?

 Aparently not, as the Internal Revenue laws specified that a stamp (or stamps) in the amount of the tax be affixed to the document.
- 2) Might it be reasonable to assume that such a surcharge was authorized on an emergency basis due to a shortage of stamps in Philadelphia? Almost definitely not, as the stamps were printed by Butler & Carpenter (later, Joseph R. Carpenter) of that very city, and were therefore probably more readily obtainable there than anywhere else in the entire nation. Furthermore, based on the abovementioned dates, the "emergency" would have lasted at least seven years!
- 3) Is there any intrinsic evidence that this surcharge is fraudulent? Yes, on my copy the "surcharge" appears over a dual cancellation (pen and handstamp), and it also seems to be this way on the photocopy I have examined. Were the surcharge bona fide, it would almost definitely appear under any cancel.
- 4) What, then, is the origin of this specimen of fiscophilic quackery?
 In reading through the first two numbers of the long-defunct Embossed
 Revenue Stamped Paper News (September and October, 1938), one item in
 each issue caught my eye. The first, reprinted from the Philadelphia Inquirer for July 29, 1938:

THE PHILADELPHIA INQUIRER,

JULY 29, 1938

Valuable Papers . Sold as Junk

A. Raymond Raff, Collector of the Port of Philedelphia, was all regrets and apologies yesterday over the fact that forty tons of valuable documents had recently been sold as "junk", but art dealers and stamp collectors and members of the Historical Society weren't feeling the least bit bed about it. In fact, they were privately exulting over some excellent bargains in history that they picked up for .05 or .10 a pound. The purchases were made by the Honock Paper Company, 414 Brown Street, which bought the "junk" for \$215.00. The Historical Society itself has already attained 400 pounds of the old records. Future sales are called off until the remaining papers are examined by an

We can surmise from the article that this might well be the source of the documents to which our "provisional' was applied, the "junk" being sold sometime in midsummer of 1938.

The second item is the advertisement reproduced below:

The rules have been revised and expanded in the interest of both bidders and sellers, so please read them carefully before you bid. Jerry and I spent a good deal of time working on these in the hope that some "gray" areas might be clarified. As printed. they represent the consensus of our opinions as to what equitable auction We both welcome rules should be. your comments and criticisms, not to mention your bids. On the subject of bidding, place your bids early, so you won't lose a lot to an earlier tie bid.

THE A.S.D.A. SHOW—As promised last month, the latest indications are that the New York Chapter will have 21 frames of material on exhibit, and that the talk will be given on Saturday November 20, at 12 noon. The show runs from November 19 through November 21 (Friday through Sunday) at Madison Square Garden in New York City. I hope to be there all three days to meet as many of you as possible.

R184 to R194 By E. B. Beaumont (ARA 247)

From the time the Spanish-American War stamps first appeared in 1898 until the stamp tax was repealed as of June 30, 1902, ther was continual loss of revenue due to washing of cancellations from the dollar values and reusing the stamps. The first step to correct this took place about December 1898, when it was ordered that all stamps from the 10c value up should be cancelled by three parallel cuts. The second attempt was the first 1900 issue (R182 and R183) which I described in the May, 1970, issue of the Revenuer.

Sometime in 1900 the Bureau started work on a new series of dollar values (R184-189). They were printed in October, and the first shipment was made on November 13, 1900. They were about the same design as those previously issued, and were printed in gray. Each stamp was overprinted with an open numeral of the value of the stamp. The overprint on the four lower values is 20 mm high; on the \$10 and \$50 it is 11½ mm high. The overprint is in a soluble black ink that the Bureau hoped would disappear in washing. Like R182 and R183 they were printed in sheets of 128, sixteen horizontal rows of eight stamps with imprint at top and bottom. Paper had the double line watermark, Scott's 191R. The perforation was hyphenhole. I have no record of the plate (continued on page 127)

AUCTION RULES

- 1. Only A.R.A. members in good standing are eligible to participate in the Auction.
- 2. All lots are sold to the highest bidder at a slight advance over the second highest bid in accordance with the following tabulation: to \$2 by 10c, to \$5 by 25c, to \$10 by 50c, to \$20 by 75c, to \$50 by \$1, over \$50 by \$2. Bids in pennies or nickels are automatically reduced to the nearest level. The right is reserved to withdraw any lot prior to the sale, or to group two or more lots. If only one bid for a lot is received, the bid shall stand without reduction.
- 3. Bids may be submitted on any paper and in any format, but should list Lot No. and bidder's maximum bid. (Winning bids will be adjusted as applicable per Rule No. 2.)
- 4. Mailing charges are payable by the purchaser, the minimum charge being 50c, higher sums will be charged only if actual charges are higher. Insurance, certification, or registration extra at bidder's expense; if desired, advise with bid. The A.R.A. assumes no responsibility for any parcels lost in the mails for lack of use of the above methods of mailing.
- 5. Invoice will be sent in advance to successful bidders, and lots forwarded upon receipt of full payment. Mail all bids and payments to the Sales Manager in Claremont, California, making all checks payable to the American Revenue Association (except Postal Money Orders, which should be made out to the Sales Manager by name in order to facilitate cashing).
- 6. Title shall remain with the A.R.A. Sales Department, acting on behalf of owners, until payment is received. The Sales Manager shall regulate the bidding, and reserves the right to refuse any bid believed by him not to be in good faith, or to act on behalf of the seller.
- 7. In case of tie bids, earliest postmark will be considered the winner.
- 8. Care has been taken to describe lots correctly. If, after the lots are delivered, the winning bidder for a lot shall prove that it has been wrongfully described, or damaged and not so noted, the bidder shall be at liberty to reject the lot within ten days of receipt, after agreement has been made with the Sales Manager. This Rule does not apply to lots marked "AS IS" for which see Rule No. 12.
- 9. No charge is made for executing bids, and the Sales Manager will act in the best interests of the bidder. However, he cannot accept responsibility for errors, omissions, or differences in judgment. Unlimited "buy" bids are not accepted. Bids with a plus sign (+) will be executed at one advance over a tie bid; while bids with two plus signs (++) will signify willingness to go somewhat higher.
- 10. Suggested Bid (SB) is owner's estimated value. Bid on these lots as you wish; same applies to "Open" and "CV." Minimum bid (MB) is owner's minimum acceptable bid, and no bids below the minimum will be entered for such lots.
- 11. SE means straight-edge, CV means catalog value (Scott Catalog numbers and values used unless otherwise specified). A hyphen between two numbers (viz. #R45-55) indicates that all of the stamps between the given numbers are included: diagonal bars (viz. #R45//55), indicate that all of the intermediate stamps are not necessarily present, and that no more than the number of stamps expressly stated should be expected. Where catalog numbers are given for State Revenues, the Hubbard-S.R.S. catalog is used.
- 12. Lots marked "AS IS" have not been counted, sorted, or appraised by the Sales Manager, and are not returnable in whole or part for any reason. The descriptions and estimated values of such lots are the owner's. "AS

(continued from page 116) numbers. Quantities used cannot be estimated with any accuracy.

There are two major varieties of the \$1 value: Surcharge omitted and pair imperf. vertically.

The issue of 1900 did not fool the crooks who were washing off cancellations, and in 1902 a new issue appeared (R190-R194). The \$3 value was dropped, otherwise the denominations were the same as previously.

The size, design, and presumably the plate layouts, were the same as the previous issue; but the color was a blue-green. Again each stamp is over-

printed with a black numeral of value, this time ornamented with scrollwork. Numerals on the \$1, \$2 and \$5 are 23½ mm high; on the \$10 and \$50 the numeral is 19½ mm high.

Each stamp required three impressions. First—the green ink of the stamp itself. Second—a colorless overprint about 14 mm square in the center of each stamp. Third—a large black numeral, part of which always falls on the colorless overprint. Soaking will always remove part of the overprinted numeral.

The stamps were first issued in January, 1902, and printing stopped May

10. As the tax was repealed as of June 30, the stamps were in use a little less than six months. Quantities issued are unknown, nor do we know the plate numbers.

Any beginning (and most advanced) collectors of World Revenues are beset by questions and hindered by the lack or scarcity of catalogs and published information. The FOREIGN FISCAL FORUM will obtain answers to your questions from various experts and publish them in this column Send questions to Don Duston, 1314 25th St., Peru, IL 61354.

What Catalogs are available covering World Revenues?

The 1915 Forbin was the last attempt to catalog Revenues on a Worldwide basis. Other individual country catalogs include: Forbin 1939 German States Supplement; Forbin 1928 Portuguese Colonies Supplement; Forbin 1925 and 1937 France and Colonies: Kremer-France 1962; Stevens-Mexico 1969; Norton-Germany 1961; Takata-Japan 1965; Bendig-China and Formosa 1957; Sissons—Canada 1969: Holmes-Canada 1968; Morley-Britiish Colonies 1910; Libertas Club-Denmark 1950; Feltus-Egypt 1965; Warren-Philippines 1968 APS Journal: Larsen-Palestine 1968, Swiss Rundschau Magazine-Switzerland 1947: Jannton-French Morocco 1962; Dodd -South Africa 1967; Enschede-Netherlands 1958; Mayr-Hanuus-Austria-Hungary 1928 updated 1969: Brofos-Norway 1961; Ittel et al—Finland and Jugoslavia and Czechoslovakia (General Issues) and Lombardy-Venetia 1969 and 1970; De Magistris-Italy 1947 and Fiume 1946; Ittel—Fiume 1971 (AR); Crofton & Corfield—British India 1905 and Ceylon 1911; Fulcher-Spain & Colonies; Morley-So. America 1901. There are other listings of Revenue stamps, mostly printed in various philatelic publications.

The Bendig China Catalog shows prices for mint stamps only. How are used stamps priced?

A rule of thumb is to price used stamps at one half mint prices. This is typical of any catalog that lists only mint, and is generally accepted.

I am interested in revenue stamps of Iceland. Do you know of any sources

of literature and stamps?

Could find no information. Would like to hear from members who can help in this area.

Do you know of any sources for foreign revenues with perforated initials?

My accumulation turned up revenue perfins from Britain, Austria, Chile. Philippines, Ceylon, India, and a few others. Great Britain perfins go back to the 1856-70 issue of the Foreign Eill stamps. Members interested in this phase of revenue collecting should contact Jack Brandt, 1006 727 6th Ave. S.W., Calgary 1, Alberta, Canada.

Is there any way to get the gum off the early Austrian and Lombardy-Venetia revenues?

Bill Ittel announced a breakthrough in this in a recent issue of Western Stamp Collector, which will also be printed soon in this journal. For the 1898 and later series, the transparent background was printed on the gum and any attempt to soak off the gum causes the background to dissolve. Still needed is a method of removing the glue from U. S. Tax Paids and the Tobacco stamps of the 1930's and also the varnish from the Wine stamps. Do any of the members have a solution?

REVENUE STAMPED PAPER NEW DISCOVERIES By Samuel S. Smith

Some months back, the discovery of a green RNP and RNV was announced. These items were found on the \$1,000 bonds of the Dubuque and Sioux City Railroad Company, issued in 1867. Now I'm pleased to report the discovery of the T type in green. I found this on a \$500 bond from the same company, issued in the same series as the \$1,000 bonds.

It seems that on the \$1,000 bonds the printer had miscalculated the tax at \$1. Accordingly, an RNW2 had been imprinted on each of the bonds. When the error was discovered, the RNW2 was overprinted with a 50c type V and a 5c type P. Both were printed in green, probably because it was a dark color and available. On the \$500 bonds, the original imprint was an RNV4, which was overprinted with a 5c type P and a 25c type T, again in green.

The issuance of these bonds was in connection with a \$900,000 sinking fund. They bore interest at the rate of 7 per cent per annum, with interest payable semiannually. Maturity was 20 years from issue, and the bond; were convertible into common stock of the company. There were 200 of the \$500 bonds, numbered 1 to 200; and 800 of the \$1,000 bonds, numbered 201 to 1,000. Each bond had 40 coupons attached, payable on the first days of May and November of each year. On the \$500 bonds the coupons were worth \$17.50 each, and on the \$1,000 bonds, \$35 each.

(Editor's Note: This is the second "discovery" article in the Stamped Paper field we have published so far this year, let's see if we can try for a few more. The goodies seem to be crawling out of the woodwork, so keep your eyes open, and when you find 'em, WRITE 'em up right away.—L.S.A.)

A MYSTERY SOLVED? U. S. WINE STAMPS CLASS A/B/C by El Hubbard (ARA 1)

It was with a sudden shock that I finally became aware of just what our wine stamps handstamped "A, B, or C" are—after looking at them for years in my collection and trying to puzzle them out.

My background in dealing in wine stamps led me to a large lot in Los Angeles when I lived there some years ago. A famous dealer passed on, and the liquidator of his philatelic estate sold me his wine stock.

Many of the wines were cancelled, but NEVER affixed to anything. They were NOT precancels, but stamps used to pay tax on contraband wine that had been confiscated, I believe, at the ports near Los Angeles. Some IRS officer evidently "leaked" them out to the stamp dealer when the tax records were no longer of use.

Since nearly all of the "A, B, or C" handstamps known were found in this stock (or presumably sold from it earlier), it has dawned on me that these too were used on contraband siezed at the ports.

Because there is no known Federal

classification of wines as "A", "B" or "C" we can safely assume that they were NOT used on wines.

There are, however, such classes for scme tobaccos, as most Revenuers know-so that leads us to the conclusion that they were provisional cigar tax stamps used to collect the tax on smuggled cigars (probably Philippine) at Southwestern U. S. ports! Obviously the use of stamps showing the denomination eased the IRS accounting process!! Any yes's or no's from readers??
