Congratulations are extended to Messrs. Alfano, Bleckwenn, the brothers Rosenberg and others for their successful efforts in obtaining at least twenty new members and reinstatements at ASDA and ANPHILEX. Obviously, this method of recruitment merits further exploitation; most stamp shows will provide lounge space without charge to recognized clubs, and recruiting materials—application blanks, sample copies of the Revenuer and other publications, ribbons, etc.—are available on request from the Secretary or Editor.

Philatelic theft, fraud and manipulation are becoming increasingly blatant and prevalent. From organized stamp burglary rings operating on a national or even international scale, to the petty gouging of circuit and approval "substituters" and the swindles of "wallpaper" purveyors, the problem is approaching epidemic proportions. You will note that for reasons of security one of our new members has declined to permit the publication of his address, or even his city of residence. To observe that this is a sad situation is to put it mildly.

As his own small contribution to sanity in a freaked-out world, your Secretary will, from time to time, identify in this column those ARA members or ex-members who have proven themselves unworthy of trust. Names will be named and particulars given, and matters of FACT will be dealt with. No accusations will be made, but patent conclusions may be drawn from the data furnished.

As a beginning, all members are a vised to avoid dealings with one Herbert Rosenblatt (ex-ARA #1253) of Venice, Calif. Mr. Rosenblatt retained ARA circuits valued at a total of \$278 for over a year, maintaining that he had never received these circuits even though his signature upon a "Notice of Mail Arrival" provided documen-tary proof to the contrary. Mr. Rosenblatt further declined to accept registered letters or telephone calls from our Sales Manager, Gerald Abrams, and finally (in December 1971) was induced to make restitution only upon direct and unequivocal threat of legal action by Mr. Abrams' attorney.

Since this episode, Mr. Rosenblatt has attempted to re-apply for ARA membership under the pseudonym "Bert Ross." "If at first you don't succeed, etc." Thanks, but no thanks, Mr. Rosenblatt/Ross.

CUSTOMS CANCELS ON CLASSIC U. S. REVENUES By Louis S. Alfano (ARA 1142)

The study of cancellations on U. S. Revenue stamps is by no means a new field of philatelic endeavor. Prior published works, however, have dealt with those cancels which were applied by various categories of commercial firms, such as match and medicine companies, insurance firms, railroads, mining companies, and steamship lines. Our present endeavor differs from all of the foregoing in that its primary concern is with obliterations applied to Internal Revenue stamps by another agency of the Treasury Department, the Customs Service.

Many type of documents upon which Documentary stamp taxes were imposed by the various Internal Revenue Acts of the Civil War period were es. sential to the importing business. Stamps denoting the payment of such taxes were affixed to these documents, and often were obliterated by Customs. It is these cancellations which are our prime concern in the present essay.

Cancels applied by custom house brokers (agents licensed to perform Customs formalities for importers) are also included, as these brokers constitute an essential part of the overall Customs operation. In the checklist, such brokers' cancels are given type numbers preceded by the letter "B."

The checklist presented is by no means exhaustive, but is intended to serve as a springboard for further study. The type numbers assigned to the cancels are those of the compiler, and are chronological insofar as is possible. Those types indicated by an asterisk (*) have not been seen by the compiler, and their sketches are based upon written descriptions.




