## Israel:

# **Current Revenues**

Israel in recent years has been subject to very high rates of inflation. On January 1, 1986, the country replaced the Shekel with a New Shekel. As a result the current postage and revenue stamps were all replaced with new stamps. We will be presenting here an overview of the pre-1986 revenues and the new 1986 issues.

[Please note, portions of this article was written and composed before the changes occured and other portions are being written as the changes occur. Editor.]

#### Pre-1986 Issues

The pre-1986 series of revenue stamps featuring a faucet and tree consists of the following 13 Shekel values: 1, 2, 5, 10, 20, 50, 100, 400, 500, 1000, 5000, 10000 and 20000. The three highest values are used only in the occupied areas or the areas beyond the *green lines* for exit permits. Collectors can only obtain these three high values by traveling to Jericho. (See the sidebar accompaying this article for more about these stamps.)

The inscription on these stamps reads, "Your tax maintains the State," at the top; "Help us to collect precise tax," at the bottom; "Computation of taxes," on the faucet; and "Services to the citizen," on the tree. In the center the Hebrew and Arabic inscriptions read "Revenue" and the denomination.

Starting August 15, 1985, there has been a set of 5 stamps without denomination. These are used only on Exit Permits and their value is based on the Jordanian Dinar. The A stamp is valued at 1 Dinar, the B at 3 Dinars, the C at 8 Dinars, the D at 26 Dinars and

the E at 31 Dinars. They are sold only in the occupied areas and only to those holding the appropriate permits needed for travel between Israel and Jordan. Collectors wishing to purchase them would have to have special permission from the Military Governor. They are known as *bridges stamps* as they are normally used on the bridges across the Jordan River.

The fees are based on those charged by; Jordan for travel to Israel. The A stamp is intended for services on the bridges. The B stamp is for those accompaning an older traveler and is below 12 years old. The C stamp is for children from 12 to 16 years old. The D stamp is for an Exit Permit (and return). The E stamp is for foreign residents to visit their relatives

in Israel: the application in this case is made by the family living in Israel.

After August, 1985, the regular Israeli revenues or Agrah stamps were not to be used on these permits. This in effect left the three high values of 5000, 10000 and 10000 Shekels withch were issued for use on these permits without any use.

The Agrah or fee stamps (the official revenues of Israel) have been issued in the following values without special overprints: 1, 2, 3 (2 types), 4, 5, 7, 7.5, 9, 10, 14, 15, 20, 22.5, 24, 25, 30 (2 types), 37.5, 40, 50 (2 types), 60, 80, 100, 120, 150, 200, 230, 260, 300, 400, 460, 500, 600, 700, 1000, 1400, 2000, 2300, 2500, 3000, 4000, 5000, 8000, 9000, 17000 and 18000 Shekels. Currently most of

the A and D Bridges Stamps. The B through D stamps are all of the same design with varying inscriptions. These stamps came into use on August 15, 1985, and replaced high value Shekel stamps; their value is based on the Jordanian Dinar.



the low values below 3000 Shekels are not in use. Again all of these will be replaced on January 1, 1986, when the New Shekel comes into use.

Recently there have been several overprinted issues for special purposes for use in Gaza or the occupied West Bank areas. Several of the Agrah stamps are overprinted in Hebrew and in an Arabic equivalent "Briooth Hevel Gaza" (Health-Gaza Area). The Arabic inscription is in two different sizes. The larger size was in the following denominations: 1, 2, 5, 50, 100 and 150 Shekels. The 1, 2 and 5 Shekel stamps were complimentary values while the 50, 100 and 150 paid tax on three classes of prescriptions. The small Arabic inscription is found on the 200 and 300 Shekel values and were used on the second and third class of prescriptions. Both types are now obsolete and the current revenues (faucet and tree stamps) are used.

Two varieties of this stamp have been noted on the 150 Shekel stamp. In some instances the "L" in the word "Shekel" is missing. Another variety

is an offset on the back of the 150 Shekel stamp of the black of the original Agrah stamp (not the overprint). This was seen quite strong on two sheets of ten stamps and fainter on the next three. This was probably caused by the printing press failing to feed a sheet of paper when the stamps were being printed.

Another health overprint on the Agrah series was "Kamat Briooth Gaza" (Health Ministery-Gaza) in both Hebrew and its Arabic equivalent. These were used since September 1, 1985, and are in the 300, 600 and 900 Shekel values. These too are now obsolete and the current Faucet and Tree stamps are used.

The overprint "Pnim Hevel Gaza" (Interior Gaza Area) in Hebrew and its Arabic equivalent on the Agrah stamps is used to designate stamps for use on permits, passports, residence identification cards and similar uses. They have been issued in the following

The top three values of the current faucet and tree revenues (the 5000, 10000 and 20000 Shekel stamps) are used only in the occupied Arab areas, the areas beyond the so called Green Lines. These high values, made necessary due to the high rate of inflation in Israel, are used on travel permits for individuals and trucks traveling between Jordan and the occupied areas. Exit permits to Jordan were set equal to those charged by Jordan for travelers to Israel


On Feburary 28, 1985, I was at the Main Post Office in Jerusalem. I asked to purchase the high revenue values, the 5000, 10000 and 20000 Shekel stamps. The postal clerk made enquiries and informed me that these values were being sold only to Arabs for exit permits to Jordan. I protested asking why the Arabs could buy them but I could not. I was informed that I could get them from the Horodus Post Office in East Jerusalem (the Arab section of the city).

I hired a taxi there but learned that the Manager would not be back until the next day and he had the keys to the locker where they were kept. I could come back the next day and purchase some but the clerk added that I could get them from the Jewish post office on Jaffa Street.

The Jaffa Street office manager apologised but he had to consult the legal advisor to see if he could The final result sell them to me. was a letter dated April 3, 1985, from the Administration of the Main Post Office in Jerusalem. It stated that, "The Custom House printed these stamps to be sold and used only in the Post Offices across the Green Line. By mistake these stamps were sent for sale to the Horodus Branch in Eastern Jerusalem." He was very sorry for the inconvenience and the trouble caused as a consequence of the misunderstanding.

values: 10, 50, 55, 100, 200, 300, 400, 500, 1000, 2000, 3000, 5000, 10000, 20000, 25000 and 50000 Shekels. The 10 Shekel stamp was prepared for use as a complimentary stamp but was never put into regular circulation or use. The top three values were put into use about April 20, 1985. These will be replaced by New Shekel stamps on January 1.

In the West Bank of Jordan area an overprint reading "Kamat Pnim" (Interior Officer (=Ministry)) in Hebrew and its Arabic equivalent on the Agrah stamps are used for identity

We finally were able to purchase copies of these stamps by traveling to Hebron or Jericho and later in East Jerusalem. Unfortunately the persons there that are selling them are not experienced with the needs of philatelists and it is hard to obtain them in good condition or with the desired tabs or plate numbers.

It might be noted that these were not the only stamps used only behind the Green Lines. Others were the 4 and 8 Ag. and the 35 liras of the 1961 series and the 35 liras of the 1979 series.





cards, passports, visas and similar uses. They are issued in the following values with black overprints: 5, 10, 14, 24, 30, 40, 50, 55, 75, 100, 125, 250, 500, 1000, 2000 and 3000 Shekels. They are issued in the following values with *maroon* overprints: 100, 300, 500, 1000, 2000, 3000 and 5000 Shekels. These stamps are also scheduled for replacement on January 1.

The 6 Lira Health Plan stamp of 1973 has gone through a number of overprints. In August, 1973, a 15 Lira surcharge was applied. In January, 1981, these stamps were surcharged 5 Shekels in Hebrew or 5 Sh. in English. The English surcharge normally reads down but is known in-

verted reading up. In April, 1982, the stamp was surcharged 11 Sh. in English reading horizontally. In November of 1983, a 50 Shekel overprint was applied and in February, 1985, a 100 Shekel overprint was applied. These stamps were used only on the West Bank of the Jordan in areas without electricity and only on one class of drugs. In the larger cities such as Jericho, Hebron and Nablus cash receipt machines were used.

#### 1986 Issues

As stated earlier, a constant high rate of inflation had reduced the value of the Shekel to very little. On January 1, 1986, the New Shekel became the official currency and all existing postage and revenue stamps were

replaced.

As of this date (this was written January 5.. Editor) three new values of the faucet and tree stamps have been issued. They are 1 (black, apple green and pink), 3 (black, apple green and brownish grey) and 5 (black, apple green and rose-lilac) New Shekels.

The set of 13 values previously used will be destroyed.

New plain Agrah stamps have been prepared but are not yet in circulation. However, there have been several overprinted Agrah stamps issued.

So far two values have been overprinted "Kamat Briooth-Azza" (Health Officer-Gaza). They are a 0.50 (magenta) and 1 New Shekel (bright green).

There have been five values overprinted for the Ministery of Interior for use on identity cards, permits, visas and passports. The overprint reads "Pnim Hevel-Azza" (Interior-Gaza Territory). Denominations issued so far are the 0.05 (magenta), 1 (bright green), 2, 5 and 10 (colors unknown) New Shekels.

There are shortages in the philatelic community of the old 13 faucet and tree stamps. The three highest values were never sold inside Israel proper, only in the occupied territories for Exit Permits to the neighboring countries. The non-denominated bridges stamps were linked to the Jordanian Dinar. The five different values totaled 69 Dinars (1 Dinar = US\$3.30). These stamps were never sold to the public and used only on exit permits.

In recent years due to the high inflation, dealers lost faith in investing in new stamp inventory. Many were running heavy deficits, especially in revenues. Few dealers kept even one full set. Since the three high values (5000, 10000 and 20000 Shekels) were sold only in Jericho, Hebron and Nablus, few knew about their existence and apparently none took the trouble to travel there to buy any. A full set of 13 faucet and tree stamps is now selling for about \$90 and will probably go much higher.

New values are sure to appear. We will keep readers of *The American Revenuer* informed of their appearance.

## **New South Wales Railway Stamps**

For the past three years I have been seeking information regarding a set of Australian New South Wales Railway stamps I purchased at a stampshow bourse. The dealer who had them knew nothing about them. I have a complete set of ten from the 1d through 5/- of the 1929 series with the first watermark but without the town name printed in the panel.

William Craig, one of the authors of *The Railway Stamps of Mainland Australia* has never seen this set in this condition. In the second supplement to this publication the authors comment about them with "Specimens? Leakage from the Government Printer?" Bill Hornadge, former editor of *Stamp News* reported them in his Cinderella Corner column and asked for comments without response.

Neither Mr. Craig nor Mr. Hornadge

## Discovered:

# A 1934 One-Third Barrel Beer Stamp

Until now, knowledge of this stamp was available only through the sketchy references in the literature of beer stamp collecting. Priester's catalogue lists the stamp as No. 210, and follows the listing with a letter "(V)" (Priester, 1979, p. 43), indicating that E. R. Vanderhoof confirmed its existence in his catalogue, A List of the Beer Stamps of the United States of American (Vanderhoof, 1954).

A study of Vanderhoof's catalogue shows this stamp listed in the Addenda as No. 181, followed by the symbols "?\*" (Vanderhoof, 1954, p. 52). These symbols indicate a stamps of "uncertain, but probable or reported, existence" (?), and "those certain rarities or unique pieces where the owner or the compiler has felt unwilling to set a value" (\*) (Vanderhoof, 1954, p. 40). An accompanying note tells us that "These stamps have been printed by the Bureau, but are not known to be in collectors' hands." (Vanderhoof, p. 52)

The existence of this stamp is now confirmed by the discovery of a used copy, which is pictured here for the first time.

As is the rest of the 1934 Issue, it is engraved and printed on white USIR watermarked paper. It is brown orange in color and bears position letter "E" and control No. 0000000420, the latter being in black. It has been canceled by perforated initials and numerals:

G B B Co CALIF•U•1114 4•11•35

This is the cancellation of the Grace Brothers Brewing Co., of Santa Rosa, California, which was in operation until 1969 and brewed 160,000 barrels of beer in its last year of operation

Friedrich and Bull, 1976, p. 4). This California usage conforms with the pattern established for the use of one-third barrels west of the Rocky Mountains (Priester, 1979, p. 67).

A search of the records of the Bureau of Engraving and Printing made by Robert Mason shows that 40,275 of these stamps were sent to the Commissioner of Internal Revenue (Mason, 1985). Considering that stamps of this Issue were printed in sheets of fifteen (Priester, 1979, p. 82), it is easy to determine that 2,685 sheets were printed and delivered to the Commissioner of Internal Revenue. Unfortunately, we do not know how many were actually sent out to District Collectors and eventually used on beer barels. Owing to the great scarcity of

this stamp over the last fifty years, it is logical to surmise that very few were actually used and indeed but one saved for posterity.

# The Revenue Stamps of Chile

The following constitutes a continuation of a listing of Chilean revenue stamps begun in *The American Revenuer*, 1984, 38:147-56. Scarcity ratings (SR) and other conventions are explained in the earlier introduction.

This section covers tourist tax stamps which first appeared in 1936 in response to a law passed at the end of

the preceding year. We believe that it levied taxes on tourist hotel bills and the lilke. The present list expands a list published by Alvaro Bonilla Lara in a supplement in *Chile Filatelico* vol 15, No. 190, June, 1973.

Adhesive special documentary taxes with respect to travel. Tourist Taxes.

The postal issues of Chile of this period appeared on paper ranging in thickness from onion skin to moderately thick and can be segregated often into four classes of thickness. The first issue of tourist tax stamps follows the same pattern.

Types 3-, 4- and 5-GT are lightly overprinted in colored burelage: Crest and Republic de Chile Turismo, except as

## Handstamped and Embossed Revenue Paper of Canton Thurgau

by Donn Lueck, ARA

The appearance of this article constitutes the first attempt at listing the revenue paper of Canton Thurgau. This does not purport to be a complete listing, nor has any attempt been made to price these items. Information leading to adequate pricing is unavailable at this time. Later, with receipt of further information, such an attempt may be made.

We trust that information presented herein will enable those of you in possession of such material to better categorize your collection. Readers able to shed additional light on these items are invited to correspond with the author at Box 11582, Phoenix, AZ 85061.

Handstamped Revenue Paper



1. A single-line oval (15 X 17-1/2 mm) with pearls around the outside inscribed "CANT•THURGAU" at the top of the oval with the figure of value in the center. The currency is below the value figure. This item is known used on a document dated 19 October 1822. The handstamp is in black. The following value is known:

#### Kreutz.



2. Same as above except the inscription reads "CANTON THURGAU" and the currency inscription reads "KREUZ." The handstamp is in black. This handstamp is found on a document dated 10 March 1838. The following value is known:

#### 4 Kruez.

3. A single-line circle, 16 mm in diameter, with pearls around the outside. The inscription at the top reads "CANTON THURGAU" with a value figure in the center and the currency indicated below the value figure. The handstamp is in black. This handstamp is found on a



doucment dated 31 January 1853. The document has an embossed 5 Rp stamp; the text and the handstamp are on the reverse side of this revenue stamped paper. At this time 1 Kreutzer was equal to 2.5 Rappen. The following value is known:

#### 1 Kreutz. Unvalued Colorless Embossing



4. A colorless embossing 23 X 27 mm, with Helvetia at the right holding a branch of fruit in her right hand and holding onto the Arms of Thurgau with her left hand. At the bottom is the inscription "C•THURGAU." This embossing is found on documents dated 1822 and 1838.



5. A colorless embossing 26 X 32 mm, with the Arms of Thurgau in the center. Inscribed above the arms is "CANTON THURGAU." There is a fancy value tablet at the bottom with the Swiss cross in the center. The following value is known:

SPECIAL No. 58.

Concerning Evidence of Payment of Tax on Distilled Spirits.

TREASURY DEPARTMENT

Office of Internal Revenue,
Washington, December 31, 1867.

The frequency with which holders of spirits are called upon to prove that the taxes thereon have been properly paid it necessary that merchandise on which taxes are paid shall be particularily described by Collectors in their receipts. That this may be done with facility, a form of certificate of payment (Form 31) has been prepared, and will be immediately furnished to all Collectors who may make requisition. This form is substantially like the permit for the withdrawal for consumption, (Form 99.) and until the new form is received. Collectors will, in all cases where a receipt for taxes on distilled spirits is required, issue a duplicate of Form 99, and will not receipt for taxes on spirits withdrawn from bond in any other form.

The Erler-Norton Catalogue of the Adhesive Revenues of Germany part II lists two series of stamps. The first from 1896/1901 comprises 6 values, i.e.: 50pf, 1M, 2M, 3M, 5M and 10M. The second issue was a provisional overprint, 25pf on the 1M.

Regarding the first issue, the remark is made that of the set the 3, 5 and 10M stamps are only known in the Bundesdruckerei in Berlin. I can now confirm that not only are all the above values in collectors hands but that an addition a 25pf reddish-brown stamp is also known. The 25pf and 3M stamps are illustrated.

I also include an illustration of the 25pf on 1M overprint as this is also a very rare stamp indeed although I have found two copies locally, one used and one mint (still with gum). The used stamp is illustrated as an aid to collectors. The overprint is obviously an handstruck rubber stamp.
