## Morton D. Joyce

Morton Dean Joyce, former ARA 2, internationally recognized philatelist and former stockbroker died September 12, 1989, of cancer in Biddeford, Maine. He was 89 years old and lived in New York City and Kennebunk, Maine.

Stamp collecting was so much a part of his life that his obituary in the New York Times of September 15, was headed "Morton D. Joyce, 89, Tax Stamp Collector And Ex-Stockbroker." He was the oldest surviving member of the American Philatelic Society (APS #139) and one of the founders of The American Revenue Association. He began collecting at the age of 8; as an adult he concentrated on U.S. revenue stamps.

Over the years Morton built one of the most extensive collections of U.S. revenue stamps in existance. For many years he would buy revenues in quantity at a time when there were few if any other buyers with either the desire for revenues or the resources to purchase them. His collection formed the basis of the book *Essays and Proofs of United States Internal Revenue Stamps* authored by; George Turner and published by the Bureau Issues Association.

At one time Morton Joyce was an active exhibitor. At FIPEX in New York City (1956), he had entered 10 exhibits of U.S. revenues totaling 41 frames. These included Private Die Proprietary stamps, essays and proofs, and the first three issues. Included were most of the largest known multiples of these issues along with many other outstanding pieces. The judges at this show combined all ten exhibits into one and awarded it the top award in the U.S. section.

He was a native of St. Paul, Minnesota, a graduate of Princeton University and for many years held a seat on the New York Stock Exchange. He served in World War I and as a lieutenant colonel with the Eight Army Air Force in England during World War II. He is survived by his wife, two daughters and three grand-daughters.

Morton Joyce wrote extensively, although mostly for periodicals. He authored *The Case of Dr. Kilmer: An Analysis of the Dr. Kilmer & Co. Provisional Proprietary Revenue Stamps Overprinted on 1895 Postage Stamps of the United States* (1954) which was published at his expense and distributed free to members of the ARA. He also co-authored *Proprietary Revenues of 1898. Precanceled Varieties* with C.H. Chappell (1957). Following is a listing of articles he authored that appeared in various periodicals. #### **ARA Auction Rules**

These rules apply to the ARA acution in this issue.

- 1. Only ARA members in good standing are eligible to participate in the auction.
- 2. The Auction Manager reserves the right to reject any bids which in his judgement are unrealistic.
- Bids should be in even dollar amounts only. All lots sold to the highest bidder at a slight advance over the next higher bid. A 10% buyers premium will be added to all successful bids. Bidding increments are as follows:

\$5 to \$29 by \$1 \$30 to \$68 by \$2 \$70 to \$195 by \$5

\$200 and over by 5% over next higher bid

- If only one bid is received for a lot it shall be sold at the amount bid or the catalog or estimated value, whichever is lower.
- 5. Buy bids or bids under \$5 will not be accepted.
- 6. Bids must be submitted on the bid sheet accompanying these rules or a reproduction or facsimile thereof. No bids will be entered after the closing date. In the case of tie bids the earliest postmark will be considered the winner.
- In the descriptions a hyphen between two numbers (e.g.: R214-222) indicates that these numbers (inclusive) are included. A slash (e.g.: R214/R222) means that all numbers are not included.
- Lots not properly described must be returned within 10 days. Lots described as defective or as having faults cannot be returned because of such defects or faults.
- Lots sold "AS IS" have not been counted or appraised by the Auction Manager and are not returnable. Bid accordingly.
- 10. If similar lots are listed and you are interested in only one of them enter "OR" between the lot numbers.
- 11. An invoice will be sent each winning bidder and lots will be forwarded upon receipt of full payment. Payment is due within 10 days of the receipt of the lots. Postage, handling and insurance will be billed the buyer, \$1.50 minimum.
- Make all checks payable to the American Revenue Association.
- 13. The placing of any bid constitutes acceptance of the foregoing rules. Prices realized will be published as soon as possible after the sale.
- 14. A 10% commission will be deducted from the final bid price when payment is made to the seller. The ARA sales will be held without reserves. Consignors may bid on

their own material and if the consignor buys back his own lot he will be charged only a 10% seller's commission and for the postage and insurance costs to return the lot. Mail bids to:





### Document of the Month (20)

## The Elusive 60¢ Second Issue on a Protested Draft


Here is a protest executed in New York on December 16, 1871, verifying the non-payment of a draft. The offending draft, which is affixed to the protest form, was made by one W.G.D. Tonge of Bainbridge, Georgia, on November 29, 1871, to T.B. Hunnewell & Co. of nearby Thomasville, for \$1400 payable at the offices of Adolphus Schaefer & Co. in New York. It

was subsequently endorsed to H.B. Clafin & Co. of New York, who presented it for payment and were refused. The protest bears a 25¢ Second Issue initialed and dated by notary James McNamee, and tied by his embossed seal.<sup>1</sup>

This draft is only the second document I have recorded that bears a 60¢ Second Issue. The stamp is scarce to begin with, in fact its use in a fairly small Georgia town comes as something of a surprise. Seeing this elusive stamp on a protested draft immediately put me in mind of a rare butterfly caught and pinned up for display. I wonder if this mean I've been chasing documents too hard lately?

George Turner's collection included a document bearing a 60¢ Second Issue with double transfer of a portion of the the 70¢ design (Turner, 1940). The document is a First of Exchange of Jay Cooke & Co. in New York dated February 2, 1872, drawn on Messrs. Bethmann Freres in Frankfurt in the amount of 10,000 florins, and also bears a 20¢ Second Issue. This was lot 486 in the 1980 sale of Turner's revenues by Daniel F. Kelleher & Co. The tax on bills of foreign exchange made in sets of three or more had been set at 2¢ per \$100 U.S. or equivalent, effective August 1, 1864. A table of foreign currency values printed in The Internal Revenue Record of September 1, 1866, lists the value of the South German florin as \$0.412. A foreign bill for 10,000 florins would thus have been liable to a tax of 84¢ at that time, and allowing for some fluctuation in currency values, the 80¢ tax paid on this note in 1872 was very probably correct.

¹This paid the tax on the protest itself. The certified statement appended to the protest required an additional 5¢ tax (Mahler, 1988), but this was not evidently generally realized. The full 30¢ tax has been paid on only about 10% of the stamped protests I have seen.



Incidentally, I have also recorded just two examples of the 60¢ Third Issue on document, one also ex-Turner and similar to the piece just described. It is a First of Exchange of Jay Cooke & Co. in New York dated August 17, 1872, drawn on Bethmann Freres in Frankfurt for 8,000 florins, bearing 4¢ and 60¢ Third Issue stamps. The other is a promissory note executed at Paris, Kentucky, on April 4, 1871, bearing a single 60¢ Third Issue. As this stamp was not issued until January 31, 1872, this example must have been back-dated.

The apparent rarity of documents bearing the Second or Third Issue  $60\phi$  stamps is actually quite typical for the "odd values" of these issues, i.e. the  $1\phi$ ,  $3\phi$ ,  $4\phi$ ,  $6\phi$ ,  $30\phi$ ,  $40\phi$ ,  $60\phi$ ,  $70\phi$ , \$1.30, \$1.60, \$1.90 and \$3.50. In fact, I have yet to record a single surviving usage of the  $70\phi$  of either issue, or of the \$1.30 or \$1.60, or a convincing usage of the  $1\phi$  Third Issue.<sup>2</sup> Of the Second Issue  $1\phi$  and \$1.90 and Third Issue  $6\phi$  I have seen just one usage, and except for the Second Issue  $2\phi$  and Third Issue  $30\phi$  and  $40\phi$ , which seem to be a bit more plentiful on document, for all the remaining stamps I have recorded fewer than five usages. In contrast, even the \$200 Second Issue is known on five documents (Mahler, 1987), 3 and I have recorded about twenty checks stamped with the Third Issue  $2\phi$ 



with inverted center. It hardly seems possible that these observations give a true picture of the relative rarity of these various stamps on document; after all, the \$200 Second Issue is cataloged at \$5250 by Scott, and the 2¢ invert at \$250, while the 70¢ Second and Third Issue are priced at only \$25 and \$30. More likely I have been able to record relatively large numbers of \$200 stamps and 2¢ inverts on document simply because these pieces are much more likely to make a strong impression on persons encountering them than, say, a document bearing a 70¢ Second Issue, and thus are more likely to eventually appear in a dealer's stock, an auction catalog, or a collection of documents. It is difficult to believe that a Third Issue 2¢ invert is truly twenty times more plentiful on document than, say, a 1¢ Second or Third Issue. If anything, one would expect it to be the other way around. I would rather believe that the most likely explanation for my observations thus far is that we have still seen only the proverbial tip of the iceberg when it comes to revenues on document. I prefer to hope that sitting unnoticed in archives, shoeboxes, the back pages of albums, and other hiding places are dozens of documents with odd-value Second and Third Issue stamps. Naturally, I would love to hear from readers who can help verify my wishful thinking.

[Note added in proof: Further consideration and discussion of the points raised here has suggested two reasons why the numbers of surviving documents bearing the \$200 Second Issue and 2¢ Third Issue inverts might be expected to be (Document of the Month—continued on page 181)

## Swaim private die variety discovered

ARA's Bill Fitch has been showing around now for some time what should be classified in Revenuer circles as the Match and Medicine stunner of the decade, or perhaps longer. Strong words but it would appear that *two major varieties* of RS234d exist which apparently have been under the noses of Match and Medicine stamp collectors for over 100 years without being noticed.




Figure 1 (above). A visa page from a passport issued in The Hague bearing an unreported overprint "den haag."

The varieties which are obviously different from 10 paces out at least, are found in the black signature of the owner of the die: Wm. Swaim (spelled with a w") in one and Wm. Suaim (spelled with a "u") in the other. Let's call them types w and u to give them monikers easy to remember; they are illustrated in Figures 1 and 2 respectively.


A slow trip through my philatelic library shed some light in beginning to answer immediate questions which come to mind.

Q. 1: Hasn't this difference ever been mentioned in the literature?

A. 1: Not that I know of. Clarence Eagle had copies of RS234d, he looked for M&M varieties and wrote about them but never said boo about this pair, but of course the stamps are rare and maybe he never had more than a single copy in his hands at the same time.

Q. 2: What has been seen in the auction marbeing exhibited by Bill Fitch. ket?

A. 2: I pulled out auction catalogs I had immediately to hand and found records of 51 sales of RS234abd and of RS235abd in which the imperf and the die cut Wm Swaims

were illustrated. I scored what I found and the results are given in Table 1. It immediately apparent that in this limited sample, the type w variety was only found on RS234d. Come to think

of it, I don't believe I have ever seen it noted that Swaim is spelled Suaim on the others.

Q. 3: The type u appears to be the normal. Are the type w fakes?

A. 3: RS234d without signature evidently is unknown so the type w wouldn't have been "crafted" from those. The Fitch copies do not appear to be altered type u. Richard Friedberg, Eric Jackson and I agreed to that when we examined them at NOJEX 88. The copies have not been expertized by the Philatelic

Foundation; as of a few months ago no copies of RS234d had ever been submitted for expertization. The Fitch pair is from an inherited portion of his collection, a collection that was formed a very long time ago.

The four copies of RS234d, type w, sold as noted in Table 1 were: Kelleher No. 546, July 17-18, 1980 (Turner) lot 1503; Siegel Rarities, 1986, lot 360, a pair which differ from Fitch; Huntington No. 103, January 24, 1988, lot 659.

If someone were playing games, one might think that they would dump their goodies on the market and run. These have dribbled in over a decade. If fakers were to play this game, why not work on the cheaper RS234d, the die cut version? RS234d is a rare stamp, and to operate on a pair!

Q. 4: If for real, how could this happen?

A. 4: Being on watermarked paper, the type w are probably a Bureau product. I think that the Bureau had a penchant for cleaning up past engraving company gaffes (while making some of their own). They may have *fixed* Swaim's signature and printed a sheet or several with the *improved* signature, only to have William tell them that this was not the way he

signed his name, right or wrong, so leave it alone.

Q. 5: What is the new type worth?

A. 5: I knew someone would ask that question. The answer is: not what Scott will list it at, as that may never happen, but about what it will bring at auction when it appears again.



## Two Mexican Documents Taxed Under the U.S. Revenue Act of 1898

Although it may seem improbable, documents that originated outside the United States could, under certain circumstances, be taxed under United States revenue laws. The two documents illustrated in this article are examples of such taxation.

Why and at what rate was the document shown in Figure 1 taxed? To answer this question it is, of course, necessary to classify this document under the Revenue Act of 1898 (30 Stat. 448). Although it bears some superficial resemblance to a check, the document is not a check. Under the Act, a check was payable "at sight or on demand" (Revenue Act of 1898, Schedule A). The tax on checks was 2¢ per check, regardless of the amount the check was drawn for.


But the illustrated document is not inscribed "payable at sight or on demand." It is inscribed "At three days sight pay to the order." As such, it was not negotiable until three days after the date it was drawn. Under the Revenue Act of 1898, the tax rate on orders "for the payment of any sum of money, otherwise than at sight or on demand" was  $2\phi$  for the first \$100 and  $2\phi$  for each additional \$100 or fraction thereof. The amount of the draft shown in Figure 1 is \$134.84 and thus the correct tax was  $4\phi$ . In payment of this tax, it bears two copies of the 1898  $2\phi$  red battleship documentary, Scott R164.

The puzzling feature of this document is that it was drawn outside of the United States, in Hoermosillo, Mexico. Why was it subject to a United States tax? From the markings on the front of the draft, it was processed by a United States bank, the State National Bank of El Paso, Texas. As it was processed thorough a U.S. bank, it was subject to the U.S. tax.

The document shown in Figures 2 (reverse) and 3 (obverse) is a close relative of the one shown in Figure 1. It was drawn by another branch of the Mexican Ore Company, this one in Chihuahau. The reverse bears a single copy of R164 with a lovely Chihuahua, Mexico, handstamp cancel. The face of this document reveals that it was properly taxed as a check. It was payable "At sight or on demand," the "three days" clause having been crossed out. Thus it became a check and was taxed 2¢ since, like the draft shown in Figure 1, it was processed through a U.S. bank.

My thanks to Anthony Giacomelli for showing me these documents. (Figures 2 and 3 on next page.)

## **AMG Travel Permit Stamps**

## a new variety

by Thomas J. Richards, ARA

The July-August 1984 issue of *The American Revenuer* examined the usage of the travel permit stamps in a passport. They were issued after the occupation of Germany by the Allied Military Government to control the entry into West Germany and Austria and saw their first usage in 1947.

These stamps are listed in the Bush/Cass catalog of 1956 and the Erler-Norton Catalogue of the Adhesive Revenue Stamps of Germany VIII of 1983. While mint copies have occasionally shown up in auctions over the years, used copies on full visa pages are quite scarce. (It should be noted that full sheets of many of the values have recently appeared in some auctions—no doubt some hoard is being dumped on the market).

Figure 1 shows the full visa page with the red \$1 value (Bush 5) tied by a 21 JUL 1950 date. The permit was issued at the Hague, Netherlands, and was valid for a trip of six days to Austria. This stamp is unusual in that it is overprinted "den haag" and unlisted, to my knowledge, by any of the current catalogues. In 1948, many of the stamps were overprinted with new values in Deutschmarks, but there is no record of the overprint described above.

Figure 2 shows an enlargement of the stamp and overprint that has been computer manipulated to enhance the detail. Does anyone have any additional information about this overprint?

higher, relative to the catalog value of the stamps, than for most other revenues. In the case of the \$200, the documents on which it was most likely to have been used—deeds and mortgages for especially valuable properties and probate papers for especially valuable estates—are much more likely to have survived than the average document. In the case of the  $2\phi$  invert, its catalog value is generally much higher than that for other revenues of comparable scarcity, on account of its status as the most affordable invert issued by the U.S. The demand for it is thus much greater than for other equally scarce revenues, with an attendant increase in its catalog value. One revenue dealer ventured the opinion that if the catalog value of this stamp were to be based solely on its scarcity, it should be on the order of \$25, not \$250.

These points soften somewhat the thrust of the article, but certainly do not negate it. For example, even if the catalog value of the 2¢ invert was only \$25, it would still be compa-


rable to those of, say, the Second or Third Issue 1¢ or 70¢ stamps. One would still be faced with explaining the great apparent rarity of the Second and Third Issue odd values on document.]
