



1991 Convention Update

The 1991 ARA convention will he held in Boxborough, Massachusetts, May 3-5 at the Boxboro Host Hotel. This is the same hotel as previously announced although it has undergone a name change (formerly it was known as the Boxborough Sheraton Hotel and Conference Center). Show rates of \$65 per night, single or double, will be available. More information will be forthcoming.

In keeping with the show's theme, "The 75th Anniversary of the U.S.—Canada Migratory Bird Treaty," the show will have a cachet designed by Burt E. Pringle of Jacksonville, Florida. Mr. Pringle designed the postage stamp marking the 50th anniversary of this treaty in 1966. The following year he was commissioned to design the Virgin Islands commemorative stamp and postal card. Mr. Pringle is also a stamp collector.

The show cachet will be in three colors and stamped with a 29φ flag stamp. Covers cost \$1.50 each or \$4.00 for one from each day. Order from Lester Goverman, Box 3035, Framingham, MA 01701 and include a stamped addressed envelope for their return.

The Massachusetts Fish and Wildlife Division will also have a cachet cover which will include a Massachusetts duck stamp. They should be ordered from Peter Pierce (Box 560, Oxford, MA 01540-0760) for \$2 each. If desired, Mr. Pierce will get these covers signed by the duck stamp designer.

Joyce beer stamps bring surprises

The Morton Dean Joyce collection of beer stamps came to market during January 1991. Strong in all areas of the beer stamp field, Mr. Joyce was not only a collector, he was an accumulator. Proofs, essays, rarities (including several "only known copy" varieties), a uniform run of all the issues, plus several stock books loaded with several thousand of the more common varieties constituted the lot.

Probably the greatest surprise was one copy each of the 10 barrel and 25 barrel 1933 Issue of a previously unreported design. Both stamps are rouletted 7 at left, have a straight edge at top, and torn separations at right and bottom, leading one to believe that they were issued in sheets of four, number 1 through 4, rouletted at left where attached to the issued book of stamps.

The paper color of the two discovery stamps is the typical greenish blue of the 1933 First Issue low value stamps; not the deep bright blue of the well known 1933 high values.

Both stamps are canceled with three sets of perforated initials, E D B Co, with two different dates, two 1-16-34 and one 12-2-33, with E D B Co accompanying each set of dates.

Used early in the life of the 1933 Issue, these stamps seem to answer what has been a nagging question regarding the high value 1933 First Issue stamps. The earliest reported use of any of the three well known varieties is February 28, 1938, approximately five years after the 1933 Issue was first used.

Certainly, there was a need for these values before 1938 once Prohibition was repealed effective December 5, 1933. 5, 10 and 25 barrel stamps were used widely before Prohibition, so the 1938 use of the high value 1933 Issue stamps left a void in time which now has probably been filled.


Why have not more of this early design survived considering the great number of the well known high value stamps in collector's hands? The story has been told that the familiar high value stamps were to have been destroyed, but the company who had the contract with the Government to destroy these stamps did not do their job too well and through some avenue allowed

The Imprinted Stamps of A. Trochsler of Boston

Regional Production of Imprinted Stamps

Prior to 1873 there were two contractors delivering stamped paper: American Phototype Company of New York City and Joseph Carpenter of Philadelphia. In 1873, the Bureau of Internal Revenue decided to expand the number of contract printers, perhaps adopting a *regional* concept to printing stamped paper. the first addition to the list of contract printers was Albert Trochsler and Company of Boston, who started deliveries in July 1873. The expansion must have been deemed successful, because a fourth printer (Morey and Sherwood of Chicago) was added in 1874 (see: Pay to the Order of...(5) in *The American Revenuer* 1990 June; 44:126-127).

A. Trochsler and Company made monthly deliveries from July 1873 until November 1875, a total of 29 months. During that time span they delivered 5,392,005 imprinted two cent stamps. What designs did Trochsler use? I believe that two designs were used, the large type N and the smaller type M. The Type N Imprinted Revenues

The evidence for A. Trochsler and Company as the printer of type N is substantial. The die for the type N stamp was approved on June 27, 1873 (Turner, 1974), and Trochsler began deliveries in July 1873 (Commissioner of Internal Revenue, 1874). The clincher that it was type N stamp that was being printed is the specimen of the type N incorporated into Trochsler's




Figure 1. A. Trochsler & Co. advertisements for 1869 and 1875.

August 1873 announcement of its commission from the U.S. Internal Revenue Department to print stamps on checks (Wald, 1983, p. 56). It seems reasonable that the large type N was the first die used by Trochsler. Further, it is apparent that Trochsler was marketing the imprinting service to the banking and mercantile community of New England. The advertisements of A. Trochsler and Company also add a mention of their appointment as a contract printer of stamped paper (Figure 1).

The distribution of extant checks with type N imprints fits the marketing plan on Trochsler's announcement very well. I have seen only two reports of examples used outside the New England states. The first, recorded by Castenholz (1989b), is a draft used in Savannah, Georgia, with the face of the draft printed by the Boston printer, Hooper, Lewis and Company. Although it is a Georgia usage, it clearly has its roots in Boston.





Figure 2b. Reverse side of check.

The second example was used in New York City with the type N imprint on the reverse of the check. The check is drawn on the Hanover National Bank Figure 2a. Check face of New York use of type N.

and the user is the printing firm of James Sutton and Company (Figure 2).

The Type M Imprinted Stamps

The case for Trochsler printing type M is less direct. Sterling (1888) designated types M and N as the "Boston Series," although he apparently did not know who the contract printer actually was. Sterling's Boston Series assertion is repeated by both Henkels (1908, 1915) and Vanderhoof (1936).

The distribution of users of checks bearing the M imprint is somewhat broader than type N. However, like type N, the majority of type M checks seems to have been used in the New England states. I have two examples used in New York state, including the scarce green color (RN-M3) on a check drawn on the Bowery National Bank (Figure 3). Castenholz (1989a, 1989b, 1990) also lists users from the following four states: Colorado—1 user, Illinois—4 users, Indiana— 1 user, and Iowa—1 user. With the two examples from

New York, this still only yields nine users of type Moutside the New England states.

Who else might have printed type M? With only one user recorded in New York City, it does not seem; plausible that type M would have been printed by the American Phototype Company.

There are no recorded users from Philadelphia, so it seems unlikely that Joseph Carpenter was the printer. Morey and Sherwood of Chicago only delivered stamps in two months, so they do not seem to be a likely candidate. That leaves only A. Trochsler and Company of Boston.

Allumettes genuine or fake?

Now that the last of the series of five catalogs for the French Colonies is finished, there is time available to research some revenue classifications of France proper. The first tackled is the Allumettes or match stamps issued in the period of 1871 to 1878. The issues studied were the small, round vignettes printed on various colors of pelure paper and on off-white ordinary paper. They were extensively reprinted. The same design was also used for the center of long bands or strip stamps used on large boxes of matches.

This study is an attempt to separate the genuine stamps from the reprints. The fakes were easily identified because they were printed on colors of paper that differ from the listed colors of the genuine stamps. usually, all values might appear in the same colors.

These identified fakes were compared with the presumed genuine stamps to pick out the differences. Stamps known to be authentic included those circular die cut stamps (5c, 8c and 20c values examined), and those from bands (no value, 4c, 5c, 8c, 10c and 40c values examined).

Not all values were included in the series of reprints, and for now, it is assumed these values were never faked. These are the $1\frac{1}{2}c$, $2\frac{1}{2}c$, 3c, 6c and 30cvalues. The $2\frac{1}{2}c$ and 3c genuine values have not been seen by the writer. A copy of the $1\frac{1}{2}c$ value, surcharged with a manuscript "2" exists.

The differences between the genuine stamps and the fakes, are as follows:



The paper colors of the fakes, and values in each color, seen by the writer, are as follows:

On pelure (tissue) paper

Rose: No value, 2c, 4c, 5c, 10c (both types), 15c, 40c, 50c and 1f

- Pale blue: Same values as for rose above.
- Pale yellow (canary): No value, 2c, 4c, 5c, 8c (both types), 10c (both types), 15c, 20c, 40c, 50c and 1f.
- Dark orange yellow (chamois): No value, 2c, 4c, 5c, 10c (Type 1), 40c, 50c and 1f.
- Orange buff: No value, 2c, 4c, 10c (both types), 15c, 40c and 1f.
- Pink: 8c (both types), 10c (both types), 20c, 40c and 1f.
- Dark magenta: No value, 2c, 4c, 5c, 10c (type 2), 15c, 40c, 50c and 1f.
- Violet: 10c (type 1).
- Grayish white: 10c (both types).
- Greenish white: 10c (type 1).

On ordinary paper

- Pale green: No value, 2c, 4c, 8c (both types), 10c (both types), 15c, 40c, 50c and 1f.
- Grayish white: No value, 2c, 4c, 10c (both types), 15c, 40c and 50c.
- Yellowish white: No value, 2c, 4c, 5c, 10c (both types), 15c, 40c, 50c and 1f.

Bright white (snow white): 10c (type 1) and 15c. On thick paper

Buff: 8c (both types) and 20c.

The stamps described as fakes are obviously so.

ternal revenue stamps. Arlington, MA: Bureau Issues Association, 1974.

The question arises as to whether reprints were also made from the original dies, or identical to those indicated to be genuine. The doubt arises in the writer's mind because three of the values (genuine), were found on the identical shades of pelure paper as other values known to be fake. These values were the 10c on pale yellow, the 15c on orange yellow (chamois), and the 50c on rose. Correspondence is invited.

Illustrations of catalog numbers 33, 34 and 35 would be welcome. Has anyone seen a copy?

In addition to the long bands with the same design type in the center, may bands exist that are typeset without the center design. Also, match box labels exist inscribed "MANUFACTURES DE L'ETAT CONTRIBUTIONS INDIRECTES" (Taxpaid).

After closely examining a group of thirty-one Second and Third Issue stamps with extraneous perforations, Brett (1990) concluded that their extra rows of perforations along the sides were almost always genuine, but that their "crazy" perforations across the interior were all fake. He then surveyed the earlier literature on extraneous perforations, and argued that his conclusions were very probably applicable as a general rule. He cited earlier testimony that most if not all fake perforations had been produced by a New York dealer around 1890, and that the motivation for this fakery had been the premium prices accorded extraneous perforations in the influential catalogs of E. B. Sterling published in the 1880s.

I personally found this analysis plausible, but feel compelled to warn that it should not be over-interpreted. Brett did not examine any First Issues with extraneous perforations, and extrapolating his conclusions to those stamps must be done with caution. Brett, himself, for the most part restricts his remarks to the Second and Third Issues, but does succumb briefly to the temptation to apply his criteria to unexamined First Issues, labeling as fakes several items illustrated by Rickerson (undated), one a perforated \$1 Mortgage with two extra rows of diagonal perforations. This stamp also has a July 1863 handstamp cancel which Rickerson states was applied after the diagonal perforations were made, as its ink runs into the perforations; these perforations thus pass one of the primary tests used by Brett to detect fakes on the Second and Third Issues, and were evidently rejected by him simply because they occur in two diagonal rows. Deciding whether this rejection is warranted is beyond the scope of the present work, but it provides an apt introduction to the point I do want to make, which is that some interior perforations on early First Issues are almost certainly genuine, as evidenced by two examples on document.

The first of these is a Third of Exchange of August Belmont & Co. of New York, February 19, 1863, drawn on Rothschild Brothers in Paris for 13,687.50 francs, the equivalent of about \$2640. The requisite tax was correctly paid with a 50¢ Foreign Exchange affixed to the back, making this a very rare EMU (Mahler, 1982 and in press). The stamp is completely imperforate except for a single row of perforations running from bottom to top and angling slightly but noticeably to the right. They begin about a third of the way across the stamp at the bottom (measuring from right to left), and end about a quarter of the way across at the top. The stamp is canceled by multiple strikes of a handstamp reading "AUGUST BELMONT & CO. N.Y. FEB 1_ 1863" (second digit of date indistinct or perhaps blank), two of which tie the stamp through the perforations, one also tying it at the right. This piece is ex-Turner, and there seems no reason to doubt it is genuine in all respects.

The second piece is a handwritten surety bond executed by one B. F. Thomas to the Board of Supervisors of Jackson County, Iowa, January 6, 1863, conditioned on the successful completion of a road. The 1862 Surety Bond tax of 50¢ was paid by a vertical pair of the 25¢ Bond, completely imperforate except for a single row of perforations very similar to that seen on the 50¢ Foreign Exchange just discussed. The perforations begin about a third of the way across the bottom of the lower stamp, angling up to roughly 10% of the way across the top of the upper stamp. The pair is canceled in manuscript, "J. Vanmeter April 29 1863," Vanmeter being one of the Board of Supervisors, the cancel tying the stamp through the perforations in fifteen places. Again, there can be little doubt this piece is completely genuine. It has certainly never been anywhere near New York; it came to light in Iowa and was owned for many years by Woodrow W. Westholm of Des Moines before being acquired by its present owner.

It is important to note that in both cases these perforations, unlike those discussed by Brett (1990), do *not* appear to be superfluous, but rather to have resulted from a botched attempt at the regular vertical perforation of the sheet. Moreover, while they do run at an angle, they are perhaps not bizarre enough to fit everyone's conception of "crazy" perforations. Nevertheless, they do provide convincing examples of genuine interior perforations on early First Issues. **References**

Literature in Review

Priced Catalog of the Revenue Stamps of Cuba, by William McP. Jones. (ISBN: none). 155 pages, 7.5 x 11 inches, plastic comb binding, card cover, priced, illustrated. Published 1990 by Pedro M. Rodriguez, Box 650753, Miami, Florida 33165-0753 for \$35. Limited edition of 200 copies.

The Priced Catalog of the Revenue Stamps of Cuba by William McP. Jones is a major resource for collectors of Cuban revenue stamps. As Jones points out in his foreword, this is the first comprehensive catalog of Cuban revenue stamps since the Forbin catalog of 1915. Jones does not claim that this first edition is complete, either in its listings or the data for issues after 1920, but it serves the purpose for which Publisher Rodriguez set out for it: "To throw light into a dim and neglected area of Cuban philately."

The catalog uses a series of numbers for each broad classification of stamps that is identified by a two letter prefix. The volume also attempts to use a single letter prefix for postage stamps listed in the Jones-Roy Handbook of Cuba.

The volume has made an attempt to be a true catalog by providing prices for most of the issues listed but, because there are few price lists for this material, collectors should use the prices as a starting point. For the most part, it appears that the editors have been conservative in their price listings.

Both the introduction and the index are listed in English and Spanish while the revenue stamp descriptions are all in English.

The catalog is divided into ten parts. Part One lists the stamps issued by the central Spanish government; Part Two stamps issued by both the Spanish government and the Republic; Part Three stamps issued by the Republic; Part Four stamps issued by the Republic for special purposes; and Part Five stamps issued by the provinces. Part Six covers issues of the municipalities; Part Seven privately issued revenue stamps; and Part Eight stamps issued with government sanction to collect fees for various pension funds.

Part Nine is one page long and covers the occupation and administration by the United States. It is the weakest section of the book and the author and the editor indicate that "much research must be done on this lost period between 1896 and 1902."

Part Ten is a handy general index alphabetically listed by type of tax and providing the two-letter prefix and the page number. The Spanish version is set up the same way.

From a technical standpoint the catalog is well edited and easy to follow although there are a number of spelling and grammatical errors throughout. The lettering is clear even though it appears to have been run on a dot matrix printer.

Actual-size illustrations of the listings are extensive. While the quality of the reproductions could be better they are, in most cases, clear enough to identify the material described.

The ten parts run continuously and the editors would have been well served it they had started each part on a separate page. The page headers start in English and Spanish in the first chapter and then are just in Spanish for the rest of the book. A detailed table of contents listing all sections in English and Spanish is located after the general table of contents. The plastic comb binding allows the book to lie flat for easy reference.

Overall, this catalog is a major contribution to the collecting of revenue stamps of Cuba. With only 200 copies printed, collectors are advised to obtain their copies now.

Arbeitsgemeinschaft Fiskalmarken for the second half of 1990 has been published by Arbeitsgemeinschaft für Fiskalmarken, a study group connected with the Bund Deutscher Philatelisten.

Their publications contains new catalog listings by Martin Erler for the cities of Bielefeld and Munich, additions to several of the Germany revenue catalogs and several short articles.

The Winter 1990-91 issue of *Atalaya* features the story of the Talyllyn Railway in Wales. This railway has used special letter stamps since 1957. Part 1 of a catalog of Rattlesnake Island locals appears as well as an articles about the Arendals Bypost, a Sarawak bogus stamp and other cinderella news.

Atalaya has now been published for more than 15 years by Christer Brunström. A sample copy is \$2 in banknotes, the latest issue and 19 back issues for \$20—all airmail—from the editor at Kungsgatan 23, S-302 45 Halmstad, Sweden.

them to fall into private hands. Whether this story is factual or not, we do not know. Wherever the truth lies, it is evident that these newly recognized first design stamps wee destroyed as intended, with few falling into collector's hands.


Other Surprises

Included in the Joyce beer stamps was an eighth barrel 1914 Provisional Issue stamp (Priester 108A) with a 1917 Provisional Issue surcharge type 102 canceled WCB Co., 9-3-18. This stamp is a new major variety to be included in the 1917 Provisional Issue fitting between current catalog numbers 136 and 137.

Among the rare beer stamps found in the Joyce collection are a nearly complete collection of known beer stamp proofs; many essays; an 1867 Issue honshead value, number 13, square cut and mint (Previously unreported in such condition): mint copies of the 1870 Issue numbers 18C, 19C and 20C; 1871 Issue third barrels (including two superb copies of number 25D); a mint copy of the 1901 third barrel, number 74; used copy of the 1902 Provisional Issue third barrel, number 79; two copies, one mint, one used (of five known copies) of the rare 1914 Issue number 125; the only known copy of the 1918 Provisional Issue number 172A (mint); one of two known copies of the 1933 First Issue hogshead, number 196A, and one each of previously unreported surcharges form the 1898 and 1918 Provisional Issues plus a new 1933 Issue \$6. rate surcharge.

The new 1918 Provisional Issue surcharge is of special interest. Ten copies of stamps bearing the new surcharge, number 172, were in the Joyce collection. All had a shortened top of the "T" of "ACT." But the real point of interest is the late date of use. All were used between December 3 and 19, 1919.

On and after January 16, 1920, it was illegal to manufacture, sell or transport intoxicating beverages. As this date approached, fewer and fewer breweries

continued to operate; instead, closing down their operations as manufacturing and distributing their products could be brought to an orderly stop. By late 1919, little beer was being sold in the United States. Indeed, before the identification of surcharge number 172 and noting its dates of use, the last reported use of a 1918 Provisional Issue stamp was October 28, 1919. This new surcharge use, therefore, significantly closes the time gap between the last reported use of beer stamps and the start of Prohibition.

Collections of beer stamps of the magnitude of the Joyce collection are few and far between. It may be many years before collectors are again treated to such an array.

Andrew Levitt is presently marketing the complete holding of Joyce revenues. Eric Jackson has purchased and is presently selling the Joyce collection of beer stamps.

Kelleher to auction Joyce revenues

The Daniel F. Kelleher Co., Inc. of Boston, owned by ARA member Stanley Richmond, will be offering major portions of the Morton Dean Joyce revenue collection over the next few months. Two sales are scheduled for May and October of this year.

The Joyce collection is probably the largest and most significant collection of U.S. revenues ever assembled. The collection was built over sixty years and incorporated many smaller specialized collections as well as huge accumulations of material assembled by Mr. Joyce.

These auctions will feature essays and proofs;

First, Second and Third Issue revenue singles, pairs, blocks and pieces; Second and Third Issue inverts, proprietaries, including blocks; later Documentaries; Stock Transfers; Wines; Playing Cards; Silver Tax; Consular Fees; embossed revenue stamps paper; and revenue stamped paper. Adhesives on document and off and many largest known multiples will be offered.

Catalogs for these sales will be offered at the regular Kelleher fee of \$5.00 each, including prices realized. The firm is accepting early mailing reservations for the catalogs. Their address is in the ad on the back cover.


