



#### an editorial

## What is meant by "American" Revenuer a statement of policy and purpose

It has become evident to your editor for some time that the adjective *American* as used in "The American Revenue Association" and "The American Revenuer" need some defining. There are serious misconceptions on the part of two differing groups of thought—those who believe that *American* should exclude anything except U.S. revenues and those who believe that it does exclude anything except U.S. revenues.

The first group is comprised of those collectors who only collect the United States and whose definition of American ends at the U.S. border. They probably also include U.S. possessions such as the Virgin Islands as American, but Canada and Mexico, despite their being in North America are not American. These collectors feel that this society and this journal should not concern itself with anything non-U.S. and that there has been too much emphasis placed on foreign revenues at the expense of their collecting area. For these collectors American means "The Revenues of the U.S. Only Association" and "The U.S. Revenues Only Journal."

Then there is the second group—those who feel that the ARA and *The American Revenuer* are U.S. only despite our efforts to be international in scope. These collectors have the belief that this society and

this journal does not want to concern itself with collecting areas outside of the U.S. and that this is evidenced by few non-U.S. articles appearing in *The American Revenuer*.

Despite verbal and written comments to the contrary, this is not a U.S. only publication. There is not a need for other publications to cover areas that we ignore or refuse to cover.

#### Reality

The adjective American as used in The American Revenue Association and in The American Revenuer refer only to the base of operations of the organization. Unfortunately there has never been another adjective to describe residents of or things from the United States than American. A more understandable name for our organization would be "The Revenue Association Based in the United States" and for our journal "The Based in the United States Revenuer."

Although based in the U.S., the ARA has members in many countries around the world. Many of these members collect U.S. revenue stamps, many do not, just as many of our members who reside in the U.S. collect the revenues of this country, many do not. Our membership directory reflects the col-

# the restrictive clauses that exist in conjunction with the Type RN-H stamped revenue paper




Figure 1. The restrictive clause on a S.C. Day and Sons sight draft, similar to Figure 1 in Czech 14. Note that when comparing the position of the restrictive clause on that draft with this one and the ones shown here in Figures 2 and 3, that the position of the clause is not consistant with either the stamp or the face printing.

Ben Czech's "Pay to the Order of...(14)" deals basically with the restrictive clauses that exist on the various RN-H type revenue stamped checks, drafts and receipts. The restrictive clause which appears on RN-H5 is part of the die: its use and pur-




Figure 2. Another S. C. Day and Sons draft; note the restrictive clause is not parallel to the line above it.

pose is quite obvious. Hence, as does Ben Czech, I see little value in any writing as relates to its restrictive clause.

The purpose of this article is to present another view of the use of the use of the various restrictive clauses that exist in conjunction with the Type RN-H imprint as reported in *The American Revenuer* of September 1992. Reference to Ben Czech's "Pay to the Order of...(14)" will be by the use of the phrase "Czech 14."

Let us begin with a discussion of RN-H3f. To date we only know of one user whose drafts carry the imprinted RN-H3f which includes the restrictive clause, "Good for Bank Check or Sight Draft Only." Czech 14 states, "An examination of the positioning of the restrictive clause shows that it is constant with respect to the face of the document, leading one to the conclusion that it was printed by Lippincot (Lippincott) and not by the Carpenter firm."

The positioning of the restrictive clause on the document is *not* constant. I support this assertion with several illustrations of S. C. Day and Sons sight drafts, all of which show the restrictive clause in positions that are *not* constant. As a matter of fact, the one line clause as printed is not parallel to the horizontal line directly above it thus giving credence to my belief that the restrictive clause and the face




Figure 3. Yet another S. C. Day draft; this time the restrictive clause runs into the line above it.




Figure 4. A seven word restrictive clause rather than the ten word clause that is on the Franklin Sugar Refinery receipt described in Czech 14 and shown here in Figure 5.

printing were done separately.

Further, one of the illustrations shows the restrictive clause printed directly on top of the blank line which in most cases does not even touch any part of the restrictive clause. This leaves unanswered the question as to who printed the restrictive clause. However, it is proof beyond question that the restrictive clause was not printed at the same time as the face of the document. In fact, it presents the possibility that receipts submitted to Carpenter for imprinting but which lacked the required restrictive clause might have been imprinted with the restrictive clause





Figure 4A. A variant of the seven word clause on the David S. Brown & Co. reciepts has no final period.







Figure 6. The restrictive clause on the Chandler printing of the Hood, Bonbright & Co. receipt similar to Figure 2 in Czech 14.

by Carpenter so as not to delay the return of the finished imprinted product to the user (Figures 1, 2 and 3).

A letter from Butler and Carpenter to Thomas Calvert of Detroit (January 15, 1868) appears to indicate the minimum wordage for a restrictive clause on receipts that would be acceptable to the Commissioner of Internal Revenue and the necessity of the restrictive clause being on the receipts before being imprinted with the revenue stamp. From my reading of this paragraph, it would make little difference who printed the restrictive clause on the drafts so long as it was done "ere we print stamps thereon."

The same letter specifies that the words "Good when used for payment of money" must be printed on the receipts. This phrase consists of seven words, and, as of this time, it is known to have been used in a one line horizontal format only on the receipts of David S. Brown & Co., Philadelphia. J.B. Chandler is the security printer (Figure 4) The statement in Czech 14 indicating that this same restrictive clause appears on the Franklin Sugar Refinery receipt is in


Figure 5. (left) A Franklin Sugar Refinery receipt with a ten word restrictive clause shown for comparison with Figure 4.

error. The restrictive clause on the Franklin Sugar Refinery receipt reads "Good when used as a receipt for payment of money." and consists of ten words (Figure 5).

The long form of the restrictive clause reads "Good when used as a receipt for the payment of money." and is used on the Hood, Bonbright & Co. receipts. These receipts exist in two different printings: one by J.B. Chandler (Figure 6) and the other by Zane (Figure 7). The restrictive clause on the Chandler printings is about one-half inch longer than the clause on the Zane printing. The Chandler printing is the earlier of the two and a used example dated "Feby 25 1868" which is about two months earlier than the earliest reported date of use in Czech 14.

Czech 14 discussed at some length the variation in the exact wording of the clauses while referring to Wald and Castenholz. Reference is made to "the presence or absence of 'the' before the word 'payment'." There is no mention of the words "as a receipt" which must not be omitted from this discussion.

The January 15, 1868, letter from the Butler and Carpenter correspondence clearly establishes a seven word phrase "Good when used for payment of money" as a phrase that fulfills the requirement for the restrictive clause. Thus, it must be recognized that although ten and eleven word restrictive clauses do exist, the seven word restrictive clause would have

been sufficient. A ten word restrictive clause printed at the lower left in *red* exists on a receipt issued by Lewis Bros. & Co., Philadelphia, dated March 30th,

1870 (Figure 8).

A ten word restrictive clause in black also exists at the bottom edge of a vertical form receipt issued




Figure 9. An eleven word restrictive clause in two lines. Someone clipped the right side of this document so that the year of usage is unknown.

by Hall & Carpenter of Philadelphia dated May 24th, 1870.

In terms of the hitherto unreported, there exists a receipt printed in black at the top of a large vertical format lettersheet that was used by Landreth's Agricultural Warehouse of Philadelphia. This receipt bears the eleven word restrictive clause in two lines reading: "GOOD WHEN ISSUED AS A RECEIPT / FOR THE PAYMENT OF MONEY." All of this restrictive clause is set in capital letters. The restrictive clause is printed directly over the RN imprint with the bottom line of the clause covering the top portion of the white circle that surrounds the lower number 2 of the RN-H imprint (Figure 9).

A Hood, Bonbright receipt printed by Zane and dated March 4, 1870, also exists. This receipt is most unusual in that the RN imprint is inverted. Other RN inverts do exist, but this type H invert is different. In the case of other RN inverts, the RN was first imprinted on blank paper by the various printers authorized by the government to do so. The face printing of the document was then printed by a security printer. In the case of this invert, it was actually created by the printer of the revenue stamp who fed the already face printed sheet into the press so the the revenue stamps might be imprinted. Thus it must be recognized that the invert was the work of the printer of the stamp and not the printer of the document. In actual fact, this is the only true invert of an RN known as of this time (Figure 10).

The last paragraph of Czech 14 poses the query as to how receipts printed from 1868 through 1870 without the restrictive clause came into existence. Only if it can be established that Butler and Carpenter never sold or imprinted revenue stamped paper (face unprinted) for stationers or security printers should there be any mystery as to why some of the

Type H receipts without the restrictive clause exist regardless of the date of usage printed or written on them. If it can be established that the views of the Commissioner of Internal Revenue was made known to every possible face printer of receipts, etc., then the explanation and reason for the Union League receipts not having the restrictive clause would not come easily. With the facts as they are, the reason is quite apparent.

Section 102 of the Revenue Act of July 1, 1862, clearly establishes and confirms as legal the practice of providing stamped paper to stationers who could at a later date print the face on the paper in accordance with their individual needs.

It was a practice among stationers to have in their possession some sheets of paper that were otherwise blank except for the RN imprint. This practice is clearly established by some of these items in my collection. If a stationer had revenue stamped paper Type H with the face of the document unprinted, what would have prevented the printer from using the revenue imprinted stock to produce some receipts? For certain, receipts produced in this manner clearly were paying the  $2\phi$  tax as required by law. This could easily explain the lack of a restrictive clause on The Union League of Philadelphia receipts as well as other similar usages of the Type H imprint on receipts that are known to exist.

Some time ago we had the opportunity of illustrating in the pages of *The American Revenuer* some Traders Labels from Swai Madhopur area in Rajasthan. More such labels for many different charities have now been found from widely separated areas like Rajasthan and West Bengal. These are all from the late 1960s period.

Today we illustrate the front and back of a cash memo from a trader in Jhunjhunu in northen Rajasthan. The back of the receipt shows labels denoting contribution for development of local habitats for cows. The कु मुद्रा (राज०) ह्मांक ६६२० वित्तंक २५,३० १८०० व्य

labels are printed in black or blue on colored paper. Denominations have been seen from five paise to one rupee.

lecting interests of our members.

Out of 16.5 pages of names listed by collecting interest in the 1990 Membership Directory, nine pages list names of those collecting various areas of the United States. This does not necessarily translate directly to 55% of the total membership since U.S. collecting is broken into small interests areas while most other national collecting areas are not. There is also considerable duplication of names within the various U.S. area as many, if not most, collectors have multiple areas of interest; this is also true of collectors who collect non-U.S. areas.

A rather large percentage of our members are not

represented in any of these listings. (Take this as a request to update your directory listing. If the 1990 does not reflect your current collecting interests, take one of the application blanks used as a mailing wrapper for TAR and mark your collecting interests on list found on the back. Send this to the editor marked with your name and the words "Directory update.")

The point is that there is considerable interest among our fellow members in the revenue stamps of the entire world. This then dictates the outlook our society should take and the direction this journal will take under my editorship.

#### Realities of Publishing

The American Revenuer is dependent upon the literary contributions of its readers. We do not go out and hire authors to write about various subjects. Those who have been members for a long time have probably noted that subject content of The American Revenuer has varied over the years. This has been largely influenced by strong writers with an interest in various areas for a period of time. In recent years some of these areas of strong influence have included foreign catalog listings, U.S. documents and usage of the mid 1800s, the German-Austrian area, U.S. stamped revenue paper, Argentina, India, and revenue collecting and exhibiting. Many other areas have received coverage although to lesser degrees.

If an area of collecting interest has not received as much coverage as you would like to see it receive, the reason is that there has been a lack of writers writing about and contributing to this journal. To gain that coverage we need authors; the needed author can either be you or someone you know. If you would like to write for *The American Revenuer* contact this editor. If you know someone who could write, encourage them to do so and contact this editor so that I can also encourage them to write. If there is an area you would like to see covered but cannot write yourself or do not know of anyone who can, contact your editor and I will try to find someone to write about it.

The publication of this journal requires a large number of contributions to continue with the size publication we have and an even larger number to expand. This editorial is an indirect solicitation for contributions to your publication. Please respond. Some of you will be contacted directly. Please respond. In the future I will continue to ask for articles to maintain a better balance of subject matter.

Contributions of all types can be used; long or short, general or detailed, illustrated or not. Catalog listings, discussions of the revenue laws, examples of usage, stamp production methods and history—political, social, economic and of the stamps themselves—are all possibilities for articles about any revenue stamp or series of stamps from anywhere in the world. Everything is wanted.

While we have often had detailed articles about the early U.S. adhesives, discussing their background, production and use, this type of research has been lacking for other areas worldwide. I have been told by those I consider potential authors that this type of coverage is not wanted by revenue collectors for Canadian Bill Stamps, or U.S. state revenue issues, or German revenues or French revenues or any other area of which you can conceive. This is not true. Simply because your fellow member does not collect an area you do, does not mean they are not inter-

ested. There is a waiting audience for articles about any revenue stamp.

The American Revenuer has an established tradition of being an internationally recognized leader in the subject of fiscal stamps. This publication has earned a reputation as being one of the better philatelic journals. While it is realized that authors may wish to have a smaller more specialized publication print their article, it is requested that you consider the potential audience, presentation and distribution your article will have here. Yes, the other publication may "need all the support it can get," your area of fiscal study will be best served by publishing here. We can and will then give subsequent technical and editorial assistance to other specialized publications often providing them with things such as halftoned illustrations and typesetting they otherwise may not be able to provide.

Translations into English of articles from other sources are also sought. However, we must be able to obtain the permission of the foreign language source of such translated reprints.

There is a small guide book available free to potential authors from this editor. Assistance with writing and editing is available as is assistance with any required illustrations including reimbursement for the cost of photographs. You are encouraged to contact the editor by mail, by telephone or by FAX. (Write: Kenneth Trettin, Editor, The American Revenuer, Rockford, Iowa 50468-0056; phone: 515-756-3542 [this is a home phone that will not be answered unless I am at home]; FAX: 515-756-3352.) Your inexperience as a writer is not a hindrance to your writing for TAR.

#### A Statement of Policy

It is held by the editors of this publication that the adjective "American" in *The American Revenuer* only describes the publication's base of operation and not its content. "Revenue" describes the content of this publication. Any of the fiscal stamps of the world are germane to this journal.

It is held that this publication is the journal of record in the English language for fiscal philately. It is the goal of the editors to maintain this internationally acknowledged level of quality and leadership among philatelic journals.

As a journal of record, primary emphasis shall be on the publication of original material. Consideration to reprint from other sources will be given to the importance of the article and its availability to the ARA membership; this consideration will include the recentness of publication and the circulation of the source.
