



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




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# **President's Letter**

# **New Discoveries in East African Revenues**

During the past several years, there have been a number of new revenue stamps discovered from the East African nations of Kenya, Uganda, Tanganyika and Zanzibar. This article summarizes the new information, supple-

## King Edward VII "Uganda Revenue" Overprints



An error in the "Uganda Revenue" overprint on the King Edward VII 1 arupee value from the East Africa and Uganda Protectorate was first described in the *Bulletin of the Fiscal Philatelic Society* (January 1915), but is not listed in the Barefoot and Hall *British Commonwealth Revenues* catalog, nor was any copy menting and clarifying listings in the Barefoot and Hall *British Commonwealth Revenues* (4th edition) catalog. Several revenues listed but not pictured in the Barefoot and Hall catalog are also illustrated in this article to aid in their identification.

is now resolved. The Barefoot and Hall British Commonwealth Revenues catalog lists a 20 and a 50 rupee large Queen definitive overprinted "Judicial Fee," but John Minn's book, British East Africa, The Stamps and Postal Stationery, does not. A subsequent article by John Minns (B. E. A., Bulletin of the East Africa Study Circle. January 1986) stated that the De La Rue archives showed no evidence of an overprint on the 20 or 50 rupee values, indicating an error in the Barefoot and Hall listing. A recent acquisition solves the mystery. Figure 1 shows the De La Rue overprint contrasted with the new discovery-a 20 rupee, locally handstamped with "JUDICIAL / FEE"; a similar local handstamp is also found on the small Queen 4 rupee value (with "Judicial Fee" reading up the stamp). These are the first examples I have seen with the local handstamp. Presumably there exists a 50 rupee with the local handstamp.

known by me. After many years of searching, I have found an example of the error. The error occurs in the letter "u" of "Revenue" which is inverted (or replaced with the letter "n"), to spell "Revenne" (Figure 2). The error is enlarged in Figure 3. This was found on a piece with two single 1 rupee values, a block of eight (4 rows, 2 columns; stamp with error is row 3, column 2 of the block) 1 rupee stamps, and a single 10 rupee. It is not known if this error occurs in any other sheet position, or on any

other values.

A new overprint type has also been found on the 1903-1908 definitives. The anna and cents values of the series were overprinted "Uganda Revenue" in a small typeface, while the rupee values bear a larger typeface (examples of the 6 cent and 5 rupee are shown in Figure 4). The 1 rupee and 10 rupee stamps are now known with the smaller typeface (Figure 4).

## King George V "Uganda Revenue" Overprints

Add to the 1918 King George V East Africa and Uganda set with a vertical overprint reading upwards a 15 cent (overprint in red). The vertical "Uganda Revenue" overprint also reads down the stamp (Figure 5). The sole value seen is the 25 cent.

The 1/- value of the 1922 definitive set is found with a sans serif overprint (Figure 6).

There are two changes to the 1935 pictorial series. The 5/- "Uganda Revenue" overprint is in red, and add a 10/- overprint in black.

## King George VI "Uganda Revenue" Overprints

The 1938 King George VI pictorial set bears a confusing array of overprint types and settings. Part of the confusion arises from the lack of illustrations in the Barefoot and Hall catalog. Several new values and overprint settings are now listed and illustrated. This entire series requires further study before a definitive listing can be written.

#### Small vs. Large Overprints

The Barefoot and Hall catalog lists a small (11.5 mm) and large 13 mm) length of the word "Uganda." An easier distinguishing characteristic is the style of the letter "d" in "Uganda." The small overprint has a flat top on the ascender of the letter "d," while the larger overprint has a sloping top to the ascender of the letter "d." Both are shown enlarged in Figure 7.

"U" to Left of "R" Overprints

The relative horizontal positions of the words "Uganda" and "Revenue" further complicate the large style overprint. A new style is the "U" to the left of "R" variety known on the 10c brown and orange, the 1/- and 2/. Two styles, the "U" to left of "R" and the "U" to right of "R" are shown in Figure 8.

#### Sans Serif Overprints

The sans serif overprint values include the 2/- (Figure 9) and the £1 (both overprints in black).

#### All Caps Serif Overprint

The £1 overprint in white or yellow (B & H 93a, 93b) is a separate typeface in an all caps serif style, not style B as listed (Figure 10).

#### Queen Elizabeth II "Uganda Revenue" Overprints

One of the most famous British Commonwealth revenue stamps is the double overprint variety on the 1/- value of the K.U.T. Queen Elizabeth II 1952 definitive series. In my notes, I have the following clipping from a stamp periodical about the error, but have no idea of the source or author:

A business concern in Kampala, Uganda, purchased at the local post office for ordinary postal use a complete sheet of the current Q.E. II 1/- stamp. This had a "Uganda Revenue" overprint across the body of the lion, which is normal for these fiscal stamps, and a second overprint throughout the sheet so placed that "Revenue" appeared at the top of each stamp and "Uganda" at the bottom, except for the top

### Modern Uganda Revenues

There remain many discoveries to be made in post-independence Uganda revenues. The 1962 Independence issue with a mixed-case "Uganda Revenue" overprint exists in several row, on which "Uganda" only was duplicated. An additional (Revenue" appears on the sheet margin below each stamp in the bottom row.

The firm used some of the stamps for postage in the ordinary way, but 65 stamps of the sheet were salvaged mint and submitted to Mr. E. M. Berry (Lytham St. Annes) for opinion. He sent six text covers to Kampala, each bearing one of the revenue stamps in conjunction with a 10c and 20c normal stamp to complete the airmail rate. All the covers came back to Britain by air without comment.

An example of one of these covers is illustrated in Figure 11 with an enlargement of the error. The existence of the 5/- overprint in black (B & H 99) is confirmed.

Additional entries in the listing of the "Kenya Judicial" overprints on the cents values of the

Kenya and Uganda 1922 series are reported. The overprint is in black (unless noted),

and occurs in both a thin and thick letter font (Figure 13). Thick overprint value seen are the 5c, 15c and 50c. The thin overprint is known on the 1c, 5c and 10c (overprint in red). I have seen the thin overprint set additionally overprinted "Specimen"—the value in this set were 1c, 5c, 10c 15c, 20c, 30c, 50c, 75c, 1/-, 2/-c 3/- (in red), 4/- (in red), 5/-, 10/- (in red) and £1.

These low values are surprisingly elusive, and were not even cataloged until 1990. Prior to this, their existence was suspected due to an overprint proof from the De La Rue archives that showed both the known high-value overprint, together with the cents value overprint.

## King George VI "Oriental" Overprint



The meaning of the "Oriental" overprint on the King George VI pictorials remains a mystery (Figure 14). One suggestion is that it is a security overprint by the Oriental Insurance Company.

New values of 1/-, 5/- and 10/- can be added to the lion series of revenues shown in Figure 16, and the 1983 issue date can be amended to at least 1982. The 20/- Hospital Tax stamp is also illustrated in Figure 17.

A recent addition to the list of Kenya revenues are the lion stamps shown in Figure 18. Values noted are 10c, 20c, 50c, 1/-, 2/-, 10/- and 20/-. A proof of an issue is shown in Figure 19—no actual revenue stamps with this design have been reported.

## Tanganyika Entertainment Tax

To clarify the Barefoot and Hall catalog entry, the two known types of Tanganyika Enteratinment Tax overprints are illustrated in Figure 21. The handstamp overprint reads "Entertainment Tax," while the properly overprinted stamp reads "E/TAX 6/-." These were applied to admission tickets.

# India: a short-lived provisional for Daman & Diu

The Indian Union territory of Goa, Daman & Diu consisted of three isolated elements-Goa, at the southern tip of Maharashtra, being the largest tract of land among the three, and Daman and Diu are two isolated pieces of land of a few square kilometers each on the sea coasts of Gujarat.

Indian Court Fee and Non-Judicial stamps were overprinted with the words "Goa, Daman & Diu" for use in this union territory. However, Goa attained separate statehood within the Indian Union recently with Daman and Diu still retaining their union territory status. Court Fee stamps, like the one illustrated here, are being used within Daman and Diu with the word "Goa" struck out by hand.

Possibly, Non-Judicial stamps are also receiving the same treatment which is likely to be short-lived once properly overprinted stamps are received from the security printers.


Figure 20. Inverted overprint on Zanzibar 1904 monogram issue.

# A First Issue Cancellation with more Information than was Required by Law

The Revenue Act of 1862 was very specific regarding the way revenue stamps were to be canceled. It said,

"In any and all cases where an adhesive stamp shall be used...the person using or affixing the same shall write thereupon the initials of his name, and the date upon which the same shall be attached or used, so that the same may not again be used." (Mahler, 1988)

This meant that each stamp on a document was to be canceled with both the initials and the date. This was very time consuming, and businesses such as banks, insurance companies and railroads where many stamps were used every day soon began to use handstamps for cancellation. The Revenue Act of 1862 did not permit this, and on March 3, 1861, an act was passed by Congress that authorized the Commissioner of Internal Revenue to prescribe a method for handstamp use. The method adopted required that handstamps give the initials or name of the individual or firm plus the date. Mahler (1988) discusses the use of handstamps intended for other uses that failed to satisfy the letter of the law for canceling revenue stamps. He referred to such use as "nominally illegal cancels."

There can be little doubt that this tax that required the use of adhesive revenue stamps was unpopular. Many of the people who used stamps to pay the tax as required by law canceled them with men and ink but did not follow the law's requirements for the cancellation of each stamp with initials and date. Pairs and blocks of stamps often had one set of initials and one date extending across them, and frequently cancels consisted of lines across the stamps, or "X"s or scribbles were used. All of these methods were "nominally illegal," but rarely if ever was anyone penalized.

In contrast, however, the illustration shows a one dollar mortgage stamp of the first issue (Scott R73c) with a manuscript cancellation that was not only legal, but went beyond the requirements of the law. Although the parts of the handwriting are difficult to read, I believe the inscription is as follows: April 15 1864 his Gatta X Marks mark Witness T. B. Bormann

Why did someone go to this much trouble to cancel this stamp? Off the document we can only guess the answer to this question. The fact that it was a mortgage stamp tells us nothing, since after the first few months of use of these stamps, the titles were made interchangeable. A dollar stamp would have paid the tax on a \$2,000 mortgage or a \$500 to \$1,000 deed, and there were other possible uses. Obviously, Gatta Marks was illiterate. I suggest that Mr. Bormann was trying to impress Mr. Marks that the signing of this document was a very serious matter.


## Kiener's Covers



I am illustrating some more of my covers and related stamps to show how I have exhibited them. This **H. E. Bucklen & Co.** cover is illustrated overall on the back, so I include a photocopy of the back. Actually, it is a difficult decision as to which is more appealing, the front or back of this cover as it is beautifully engraved. To solve the problem, I show the cover at the top of the page and the back at the bottom with two precanceled battleships separating them. H. E. Bucklen & Co., as well as many others of this era cause a bit of a stir with the medicine bottle collector, as the names of these companies mean as much to them as they do to the RS and RB collector.

This cover from the **Chamberlain Medicine Co** is a multicolored cover in red, yellow and black. Being from 1911 it lacks the zip of the pre-Food and Drug covers on which Chamberlain's Stomach and Liver Tablets would have been touted as curing dyspepsia, flatulence and diseased blood problems. However, it is still a very attractive cover and with the two precancels makes a very presentable page.

This Alonzo O. Bliss cover gives me the opportunity to show two different precancels used by this company. It also gives me the



space, though briefly, to explain the usage of the tax stamps, that is the  $1/8\varphi$  was for a  $5\varphi$ item,  $5/8\varphi$  for a  $25\varphi$  item,  $1 \ 1/4\varphi$  for a  $50\varphi$  item and so on. With tongue in cheek, I say that so the judges are aware of how these stamps were used. This cover comes with an enclosure which states on the bill head that the firm is successors to the Dr. Perkins Medical Company (1893) whose advertising is identical to that on the Bliss cover.

# **Japanese Hand-Etched Cocoon Guarantee Stamps**

#### by M. B. McNeil, ARA

In 1873 the Japanese government issued tax stamps for use on guarantees of silk cocoons. These are listed in Furuya's 1983 *Standard Japanese Fiscal Catalogue* as 15 and 16.

Furuya 15, 5 sen gray (and Furuya 15A, the same stamp in a black shade) is fairly common unused, even in blocks (see Figure 1), and distinctly scarcer used (Figure 2 shows two copies used on a document).







Figure 3. The 10 sen turquoise cocoon guarantee stamp with a red-dot specimen overprint.

Furuya 16, 10 sen turquoise (and Furuya 16A, the same stamp in a blue shade) is very rare and I know of no used copy (Figure 3 illustrates a copy with a red-dot sumiten specimen overprint). Figure 2 shows Furuya 15 used to pay a 10 sen rate, as does another document (both are in the Furuya collection). It seems plausible that the authorities decided that it was just as convenient to let taxpayers use pairs of the 5 sen stamp rather than a single of the 10 sen.

The stamps were withdrawn April 25, 1877; the last usage I have seen is August 6, 1876.


