





Given that the Postal Service said they would begin shipping orders December 1 (but obviously did not!). The marketing permits for naval stores

A discussion of marketing permits may appear to be completely out of place in a journal devoted to revenue stamps, but a closer examination shows that their inclusion makes sense. Although the permits in question are physically larger than the usual revenue stamp, their size is comparable to that of the distillery warehouse issues and many of the tobacco stamps. Their purpose, like that of several recognized revenue issues, was to control the marketing of agricultural commodities in times of economic hardship. They were, in fact, created by the same federal legislation. Additionally, these permits cerpublic. More recently, the term has been defined to include only turpentine and rosin, chemical commodities still important to a variety of industries, but having little current connection with shipbuilding.

Figure 1 shows an 1870 cover with the printed return of a dealer in naval stores.

Turpentine is a processed substance made by distilling the thick sticky gum exuded when the sapwood of pine trees is wounded. This gum is not the sap of the tree, however, but a complex mixture of chemicals produced within special cells scattered throughout the sapwood. If heated in a still, the gum releases a volatile liquid called *spirits of tur*-

> *pentine*, leaving a heavier residue which, when cooled, solidifies to form *rosin*.

> Like other distillation products, turpentine has been known for many years (it was produced in Maine as early as 1606) during which time it has found an assortment of uses. We are all familiar with its use as a vehicle for paints and varnishes. In purified form, turpentine also has a number of medicinal applications: externally in liniments and antiseptics, internally as an anthelmintic and carminative. Veterinary medicine has long employed it as a di-

uretic and stomachic. In the heyday of patent medicines, turpentine was a familiar ingredient in many popular nostrums. By the late 1920s, industraial consumption of turpentine in this country exceeded 5 million gallons per year, and we were exporting three-times that much annually.

The commercial uses of rosin are less familiar, but still account for significant quantities of a substance whose statistics are kept in units of barrels weighing 500 pounds each. Although many industrial operations utilize rosin to the extent of tens of thousands of such barrels per year, nearly 90% of the country's production is consumed by just three industries: paper making, varnish

An 1870 cover with the printed corner card of a dealer in naval stores. tainly fall within the definition of revenue stamps given in the APS's *Manual of Philatelic Judging*, third edition, which states that they "are receipts for....permissions" and include "federal....stamps issued for many reasons."

Today, few people understand the meaning of *naval stores*. A relic from the days of wooden sailing ships when the phrase included all raw materials used to build and maintain such vessels, it later came to mean only those products—turpentine, rosin, pine oil and tar and pitch—derived from the oleoresin of the pine tree. Throughout the 19th century, naval stores were recognized articles of commerce generally available to the manufacture and soap production. the average annual consumption of rosin by these three industries during the 1920s totaled more than 750,000 barrels.

Not surprisingly, the popularity of turpentine and rosin in consumer goods attracted the authors of tax laws years ago. The lengthy Tariff Act of 1842 first placed (5 Stat. 548) a 10 cent per gallon duty on spirits of turpentine, but four years later this was changed (9 Stat. 42) to a duty of 20% ad valorem. Federal Civil War legislation (13 Stat. 202) raised the import duty to 30 cents per gallon, and introduced the first internal tax on domestic turpentine at the rate of 20 cents per gallon. The taxation of rosin depended upon its purity. Crude gums and gum resins were included on the list of duty-free imports but refined materials intended for drug use were taxed ad valorem at rates varying from 10% to 25%. The Confederacy taxed all naval stores at the rate of 8% ad valorem.

The 1864 legislation that first taxed domestic turpentine also included some language that proved later to be prophetic. Two statements are particularly pertinent:


"laws relating to the assessment and collection of the duties on cotton,...so far as...applicable..., shall apply to the....duties on spirits of turpentine.

"every collector to whom any duty upon cotton shall be paid shall mark the bales....upon which the duty shall have been paid....and shall give to the owner,...a permit for the removal of the same."

It should be recalled that the processing of pine tree gum generally is carried out at rural locations, near the plantations of trees tapped to collect it. This practice is not too different from that which saw cotton gins located in small rural towns, a short distance from the cotton fields of the small farms that grew it. It simply did not pay to carry either crude gum or unginned cotton very far from its source.

On March 3, 1923, Congressed passed (42 Stat. 1435) the Naval Stores Act that defined such materials, established standards of purity and authorized the Department of Agriculture to supervise their production and sale. By that time, the post-World War I depression in agriculture had been deepening for several years. The market prices of farm products continued to decline, but instead of cutting back production, many farmers increased their output which they then had to sell—if they could—at even lower prices. Agricultural surpluses continued to accumulate. (Revenuers trace the 1939-41 cotton order/surplus cotton order stamps and the food order/surplus food order stamps to the programs developed to eliminate these surpluses.) On June 15, 1929, Congress passed (46 Stat. 11) the Agricultural Marketing Act "to promote the effective merchandising of agricultural commodities." Two years later, that act was amended (46 Stat. 1550) to include crude gum, gum spirits of turpentine and gum rosin among the commodities being regulated. Still later, on May 12, 1933, the Agricultural Adjustment Act was approved (48 Stat. 31).

Among other provisions of this act, one permitted the producers of specified commodities to enter into marketing agreements








Figure 3. A 1935 permit to market a wooden barrel of gum rosin (reduced). with the Department of Agriculture. The primary purpose of such agreements was to establish and maintain a balance between the production and consumption of those commodities such as to re-establish the prices paid to farmers at some predetermined level (parity). Involvement of any producer was voluntary, but if he chose to participate in a program, he had to accept a limit upon the amount he could market without penalty (a marketing quota). (Recall the 1934 Tobacco Sale Tax stamps and the 1935 Potato Tax/ Tax-Exempt Potatoes stamps.)

The marketing agreement and license system for gum-turpentine and gum-rosin processors were executed by Secretary of Agriculture Henry A. Wallace on February 20, 1934, effective the following day. Nearly 1,200 processors in seven southern states signed the agreement to accept quotas to be determined by a nine-man control committee elected by them from their own ranks. Individual quotas were based upon each processor's production history for the preceding four years where possible, or upon a lesser time period approved by the committee for newer processors. The quotas could be revised annually, based upon reports and records furnished by the licenses processors upon request by the Secretary of Agriculture.

To defray the expenses incurred in the administration of this agreement, several charges were established. These included 3φ for each barrel of gum turpentine and 1φ for each barrel of rosin for which a quota allotment was requested, payment to accompany the written application, and 1φ , 5φ , 6φ or 15φ for each "identifying stamp or metal tag" required to be attached to every package of turpentine or rosin shipped by the processor, the cost of a stamp or tag depending upon the size or weight of the package and its contents.

This labeling of each original package was required "on and after the 2d day of April 1934," using stamps or tags supplied by the control committee, but paid for by the processor as noted above. The marketing agreement specified that "each stamp or tag shall be plainly marked with a *number* identifying the licensee, the *serial number* of the tag, the year of production, and specification of the contents." I have not been able to locate a sample metal tag, nor have I ever spoken to anyone who has seen one. I doubt, in fact, that such tags ever were produced since their cost would have been considerably greater than the charges listed. But "identifying stamps" certainly do exist in the form of the market permits that are the subject of this paper.

Figure 2 shows a permit to market gum spirits of turpentine. Approximately $8\frac{1}{4}$ x 3 inches in size and ungummed, this colorful stamp (in black, red and browish-yellow) was lithographed on thin, off-white, paper by The H. & W. B. Drew Co., Jacksonville, Florida. No watermark is evident, but a background of repeated vertical lines, printed in 2 mm caps in browinish-yellow, and reading "GUMROSINBUMTURPENTINE," create the effect of a safety paper. Approximately $3\frac{1}{4}$ inches from the right end, the stamp is rouletted 6 to permit the separation of a stub. Note that all four required data are present: the processor's number (412), the serial number (608), the year (1935) and the specification of the contents (one cask, gum spirits turpentine). Additionally, the printed legend (in black) cites the provisions of the 1934 marketing agreement and license as the authority behind this permit. According to that document, this particular stamp would have cost the processor 15φ . The identity of Processor No. 412 is not known, but he most likely was based in Georgia since 725 of the nearly 1,200 licensees were located there.

Figure 3 shows a permit to market gum rosin. Except for the change in colors—black, red and pale green there—this stamp duplicates that for turpentine in design and size. the processor and year are the same: the (red) serial number (2106) and (red) specification (one wooden barrel, gum rosin) are different. According to the published list of service charges, this stamp cost the licensee 5c.

Assuming that similar stamps were prepared for eventual attachment to the othersized packages in which naval stores were normally marketed, four have not been seen. For Gum turpentine, a stamp costing 15ϕ for each 50 gallons loaded into a tank car; for gum rosin, a 6\$ stamp for a metal package (barrel?) of approximately 600 pounds and a 2ϕ stamp for each 100 pounds or fraction thereof transported in a tank car; for crude or cleaned gum, a 6 ϕ identifying stamp for each barrel containing approximately 50 gallons.

The controlling contract, Marketing Agreement #36, provided for termination by the Secretary of Agriculture whenever he or a 70% majority of the contracting processors decided it was no longer needed. That agreement and the accompanying license for gumturpentine and gum-rosin were canceled, effective midnight of July 31, 1935 (Report, page 78). Thus, regulation of naval stores by manes of a quota system designed to restrict the supply of such materials lasted less than a year and a half. The marketing quotas, determined by the control committee not later than March 7, 1934, the first year, and by October 15 of each succeeding year thereafter, governed the total volume of turpentine and rosin that could be marketed during the ensuing calendar year. Therefore, permits, stamps or tags dated other than 1935 would not have bee needed and, presumably, were not prepared.

If any reader has seen such items, or knows of stamps intended for use with turpentine or rosin packaged in containers of other sizes, the author would like to hear from them.

pioneer vintner

Hamilton Crabb

About two years ago, Bert Kiener asked me if I had any idea who might have been responsible for the 1898 precancel "To-K. W. Co." on some 2φ proprietary battleship stamps. I had no idea of the adventure that would lie behind this cancel. This was strongly suspected to be a wine company because of the 2φ denomination, some dates in




A 2¢ battleship with a cancel thought to be from a winery. the precancels were after June 30, 1901 (wines continued to be taxed into 1902 following the cessation of the tax on medicines), and the "W" preceding "Co." in the cancel. One possibility was a company specializing in Tokay varietal wines.

After searching my notes and reference materials, this revenue tax period was several years ahead of the popularity of Tokay varietal wines and the large-scale production of these wines that ensued. However, at this time, Tokay wines were made, and there even was a Tokay Vineyard in Fayetteville, South Carolina, which produced wines. Yet the hyphenation in the cancel seemed quite strange. My curiosity turned to searching for any names with this unusual hyphenation. Interestingly, a famous pioneering vineyard in Napa Valley with the unusual name To Kalon surfaced in this search. Could this be the company behind the cancel? I decided to dig further into the history of this vineyard to see if a link made any sense.

The To Kalon vineyard was the product of Hamilton Walker Crabb, one of the most prominent figures in California viticulture. Attracted by the gold rush, he farmed in Alameda County until 1865, when he went to Napa County and purchased property in Oakville. He turned from table grapes to wine, and was among the first to introduce and import many foreign varieties of vines, and to improve the native California stock. Crabb was probably the first to begin experimental rootstock work in Napa Valley when, in 1877, he replanted vineyards with native rootstock after phylloxera hit (an aphid which attacked roots and decimated grape crops worldwide). Although his rootstock efforts were not successful, this was many years ahead of full appreciation of the phylloxera pandemic.

Crabb is also credited with being the first to introduce machinery into winemaking. He used a steam crusher and hydraulic pump in his facilities which became quite extensive. In 1886, he renamed his vineyards, winery and brand "To Kalon," Greek meaning "that which is good," or "that which is beautiful." Crabb added that "I try to make it mean the boss vineyard." According to some reports, Crabb was the third largest winegrower in Napa Valley after Charles Krug and Gottlieb Groezinger.

While a vineyard of operations this size seemed a possible candidate for this cancel, there were a few problems. First, the wine price list surveys from 1898, found, for example, in the California Wines and Brandies section of the American Wine Press and Mineral Water News, mention only H. W. Crabb, Oakville, Cal., with a listing of many specific wines he bottled, but without any mention of the To Kalon brand name. Second, I have an 1898 precancel specifically for H. W. Crabb on the 2¢ proprietary. The cancel is "H. W. /

SEP / 15 / 1898 / CRABB" in a rectangular box, handstamped in black ink. Unfortunately, the strike is weak and too poor for a good photograph. Third, an 1898 issue of the *American Wine Press and Mineral Water News* praises The To-Kalon Wine Co. for its business savvy and describes it as a retail wine house in *Washington*, *D.C.*, which has built up a strong trade through advertising. No mention is made of Crabb or any relationship to his operations. Could this information be reconciled?

Discussion with Nina Wemyss, a research historian with the Robert Mondavi Winery (present owner of the To Kalon properties), Oakville, California, indicated that Crabb was also a pioneer in the marketing of fine varietal wines, and that by the 1880s, he had established agencies in the East, Midwest and South for his To Kalon brand of cased goods. In fact, Napa Valley's early prominence was apparently due in good part to his successful marketing efforts. Also, she informed me that Crabb shipped some wine in bulk under the To Kalon label to San Francisco merchants and also bottled wine in his own cellar for direct sale to consumers. This information suggested that there probably

was a connection between The To-K. Wine Co. of Washington, D.C., and Crabb, in addition to his local retailing operations in California.

Finally, the most direct link appeared in an obituary for Crabb which appeared in the *American Wine Press and Mineral Water News* in 1899. the obituary states, "With rare enterprise he established agencies for the sale of To-Kalon wines in three large cities in San Francisco, Chicago, and Washington, D.C." Note the use of the hyphen. Thus, it appears most likely that the To-K. W. Co. precancel is from these agencies which retailed his cased wine goods. The H. W. Crabb precancel is probably from his California operations.

There is one additional known precancel which is also shown here. This was kindly provided by Tony Giacomelli for inclusion in this story as another variant of the To-K. W. Co. cancel. This precancel spells out "TO KALON / JUN / 6 / 1902 / V. CO." (no hyphen and a substitution of V (Vineyard?) for W are used, just to keep things interesting) and is known on the 1¢ and 2¢ proprietary stamps. These stamps bear dates after Crabb's death and may possibly reflect changes in the Oakville business. I am not aware of anyone with these stamps "on piece," but, as with most precancel studies, it would be wonderful if someone could offer definitive proof from their winecellar!

not to be missed, Tom Kingsley's book *The Legendary Persian Rug* garnered a gold at the literature competition last August at StampShow in Pittsburgh. An outstanding accomplishment and even though you may neither own one of the "rugs" nor even aspire to own one (that description fits me, too!), you should own this book.

If you are like me, I suspect that some of you who read the first paragraph are still muttering under your breath that revenues have been at various times contaminated with marketing schemes. While most of the exploitation in our field has been by suspect dealers, the governor's edition versions of state duck stamps certainly qualify as an issuing agency scheme aimed at stamp collectors. But there are the collector-demanded district collector handstamped "Narcotic" stamps that have not been seen used. There are also various fraudulent items, such as "Marshall Islands" overprinted on U.S. cigarette stamps from the 1930s and "Narcotic" handstamps on the 1914 wine stamps that were created by some unethical collector or dealer. But all the Postal Service marketing hype could only be matched on our side of the hobby by Indian (oops, make that "Native American") Chief editions of annual reservation fish and game fee stamps made available only through the slot machines on the reservation gambling casinos. Of course the printer would a year later offer imperforate and part perforated versions with missing colors!

Let's hope 1995 will be a year of growth for your collection and for the ARA. Without the marketer's shenanigans!

stamps. The article then goes on to divide stamps into two categories (stamps that pay an impost and second those that pay for a service) which are then subdivided.

Additional articles look into the background behind the early Chinese revenue stamps and makes a somewhat overview of the field. The QE II "B of E" (bill of exchange) and contract note stamps of Hong Kong first issued in 1954 are examined. Various types are noted and the different denominations by issue are indicated on a checked chart. Robson Lowe continues to look at some of the Waterlow proofs, this time from some of the

Domenico Facci

Long-time ARA member Domenico Facci passed away on November 7, 1994, at the age of 78. He was a dedicated and enthusiastic collector of Italy and the Italian States and enjoyed speaking about his voluminous collections. He was also a member of the Collectors Club of New York.

Professionally, he was a highly respected sculptor in the classical tradition creating a variety of works that included the American Indian states. Some newly discovered 1866 correspondence about revenue stamps between Peru and the American Banknote Company is begun to be serialized.

Short articles also look at the star issue of the State of São Paolo, Brazil and a 1916 recut die from Brazil. Society news and reviews round out the issue. Information about membership in the Revenue Society of Great Britain be obtained from the Secretary Tony Hall, 53a High Street, Whitwell, Hitchin, Herts SG4 8AJ, U.K. Mention *The American Revenuer*.


