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The Danish tax stamps on phonograph records

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This article describes the tax stamps used by the Danish customs authorities at the settlement of the import duty on phonograph records. The article does not pretend to give a complete overview of the tax stamps and the background history, because a lot of information is still needed, but hopefully it can serve as a guide. Corrections and additional information are welcome.

The introduction of tax stamps for phonograph records is neither mentioned in the tax laws nor in the printed circulars of the customs authorities. However, the stamps are found on records from the 1920s, 1930s and 1940s. Since the records may have been several years old at the time of import, the stamps probably were introduced in the late 1920s or in the early 1930s and probably went out of use in 1950 when the import duty on phonograph records was abolished and replaced by a general sales or turnover tax on foreign as well as Danish records.

Presumably the tax stamps were printed as coil stamps, which were perforated, gummed, and wound up on a reel. This facilitated the detachment and the sticking of the stamps on the records. The stamps were always affixed to the round label on the middle of the record, never to the cover. The records upon which the stamps have been found are all 78 rpm.

As a consequence of the way the stamps were made, the first and the last stamp of each reel was only perforated on one side, while the other stamps were perforated on two sides. Beside these three variations, some stamps are found with two perforation sizes (10 $\frac{3}{4}$ and 11 $\frac{1}{4}$).

The stamps are found with statement of value as well as without such statement. The first ones either state the total value of duty (Type I), or they only state the value of an additional duty (Type II). The stamps without statement of value (Type III and IV) were used to indicate that the records were ex-

empt from customs duty, for instance in the case of records produced in Denmark, since Danish records of course were not liable to the import duty.

The import duty on phonograph records was designed

as a tax assessed on the weight. According to the tariff of 1924, phonograph records belonged to the tariff position number 116 together with certain musical instruments and accessories. Goods of this position were assessed at 0.70 crowns per kilogram. On April 1, 1942, the tariff position was modified, and records were assigned position number 116d, which was taxed at 2 crowns per kg, or an additional duty of 1.30 crowns per kilogram. However, on November 20, 1942, the duty was lowered to 1 crown per kg, an additional duty of only 0.30 crowns. This level was kept until November 20, 1950, when records were assessed with a turnover tax of 20 percent.

The records with tax stamps are found in two sizes, and therefore two classes of weight exist; furthermore, the weight of the records within each of these classes could vary. However, normally the duty for each record was settled as a round figure. Thus, when the additional duty in November 1942 was fixed at 0.30 crown per kilogram, a new stamp with a value of 0.06 crown is believed to have been issued (number 7) corresponding to a weight of 200 grams, which was the normal weight of a small record. But very soon another stamp with a more round figure was issued: 0.05 crown (number 6). The 0.06 crown stamp is one the rarest tax stamps for phonograph records, since the stamp presumably was used only for a short period.

The following overview includes the stamps whose existence I know from private collections. Some stamps with a stated value (numbers 4 and 5) are found on small records as well as on large records. This must reflect

that they were used in connection with two different rates of duty. Thus, by removing the stamp from the record, the collector loses information. It is recommended to collect the whole record including the stamp, if possible. Furthermore, some records have the year of production and other interesting informa-

tion, which also should be kept.

Of the four known types of stamps, Types I and III are believed to be the oldest, while Types II and IV, which mention the additional duty, must be from 1942 or later. All stamps are without watermark.

The catalog

Recommended abbreviations for use in connection with the catalog numbers in order to identify the stamps:

- S = Items found on small records (with a diameter of about 25 cm or 10 inches, and with a weight of about 150–225 grams).
 L = Items found on large records (with a diameter of about 30 cm or 12 inches, and with a weight of about 275–325 grams).
 b = Beginning items: perforated on the bottom side (Type I, III and IV) or the right side (Type II).
 m = Middle items: perforated on both sides.
 e = End items: perforated on the top side (type I, III and IV) or the left side (type II).

The listed prices should be regarded only as rough estimates reflecting the rarity of stamps in very fine condition (no missing

parts and no conspicuous miscoloring; however, back side discoloring resulting from set off from the color of the record label is accepted). For stamps unremoved from the record, the value of the record itself (generally about 5.00 crowns or more) should be added. Some stamps are more rare affixed to small records than to large records, or vice versa; these cases are not priced separately, but are described in the notes. Generally, stamps perforated on only one side are less common than stamps perforated on two sides, and the prices of these stamps should be increased by 50–100%; however, one side perforated stamps of numbers 11A and 11B demand no additional value as explained below. All prices are in Danish crowns (100 crowns = about U.S. \$16).

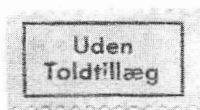

The paper found on varieties A and B are thicker and have a smoother surface than variety C. Variety A's paper is coated with the yellow only on the face while the back is white. Variety B's paper has a yellow coating on a brownish paper which makes the face appear as a orange yellow. Variety C's paper is yellow on both sides similar to numbers 6 and 7. Stamps 11A and 11B with only one side perforated are just as common as those with two sides perforated. This might reflect that the stamps may not have been made in coils but rather as small booklet panes.

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Two stamps

Some records are found with two stamps. These cases can be divided into three groups:

1. *Overstamping*. Large records with a Kr. 0.10 stamp affixed on top of a no-duty stamp (number 8 over number 11A). Several items are known. Was

restamping due to a mistake?

Two examples of a similar case are also known to me. A small record has a Kr. 0.05 stamp affixed over the top of a no-duty stamp (number 6 over a number 11A).

Other cases of overstamping are also known with Type I stamps hiding other Type I stamps. This overstamping makes it difficult to identify the lower stamp unless the upper stamp is removed.

2. *Pairs of stamps*. A large record weighing about 280 grams is known with a pair of 15 øre (number 3Ax) stamps. The date 1943.2.6 is written in pencil on the stamps, probably an owner mark indicating the date of purchase.

According to the weight and date the customs duty on this record should have been 0.28 crown, or rounded to 0.30 crown at a rate of 1.00 crown per kg. If assessed according to the additional customs duty, the tax should have been 0.08 crown, or rounded to 0.10 crown at a rate of 0.30 crown per kg. Normally, such a record should bear a 0.10 crown stamp (number 8). If the customs house was out of this stamp, two 0.05 crown stamps could have been used. However, the record has 0.30 crown worth of stamps affixed, the value of the total duty. Since no 0.30 crown stamps were issued, two 0.15 crown stamps were used.

Maybe this way of settling the duty indicates that the record was privately imported and taxed at the time of the clearance of baggage through customs. At any rate, two things can be learned from this instance regarding the period after the 1942 duty change: 1. Stamping the total duty was an alternative to stamping the additional duty. 2. Stamps of Type I and Type II were in use at the same time.

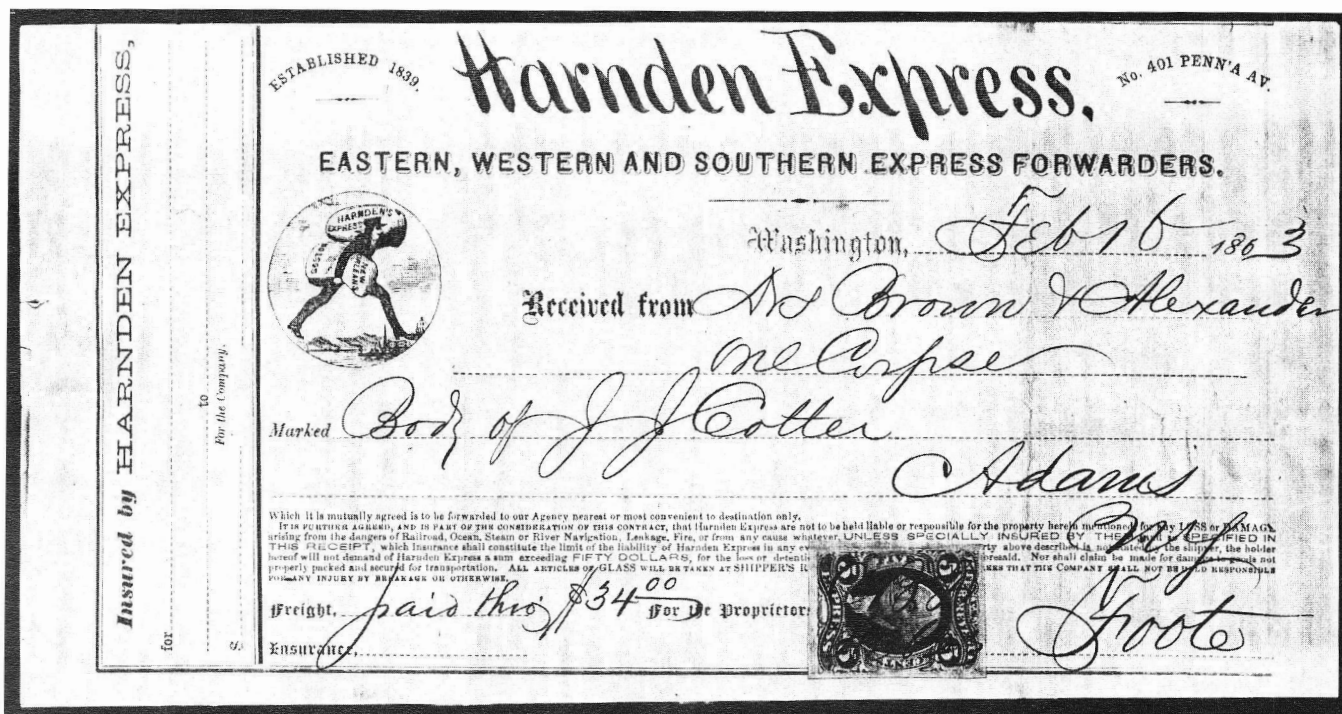
3. *Stamping two sides*. Several small records are known with two 15 øre (number 3Bx) stamps—one on each side. Was this double stamping by mistake or did it represent a customs duty of 30 øre? A similar case is known where a large record has two 20 øre stamps (number 4Bx). Only one such item has been seen.

Danish taxpaid articles in progress

Paul A. Nelson of Claremont, California, has been working with Claus Rafner of Denmark on articles about Danish taxpaid stamps for tobacco products and for alcoholic beverages. Express company receipt for human body

In reference to Robert Betz's article in the April 1997 issue of *The American Revenuer* concerning an Adams Express Company receipt for "one body," illustrated here is a similar document which does bear a first issue Express stamp. This is an interesting Early Matching Usage of the imperforate variety by the Harnden Express Company of Washington, D. C.

The Harnden receipt, used in February 1863, was taxed under the provision for express receipts in the Revenue Act of July 1,

1862, which reads, "When one or more packages are sent to the same address at the same time, and the compensation therefor exceeds one dollar, five cents," as it cost \$34 to ship the body of J. J. Cotter. The Act of March 3, 1863, repealed the specific stamp duties on the express business, and imposed a tax of two percent of gross receipts in its place. The Adams document, issued in February 1865, was apparently taxed under the provision of the Act of June 17, 1864, calling for two cents on "a receipt for the delivery of any property."

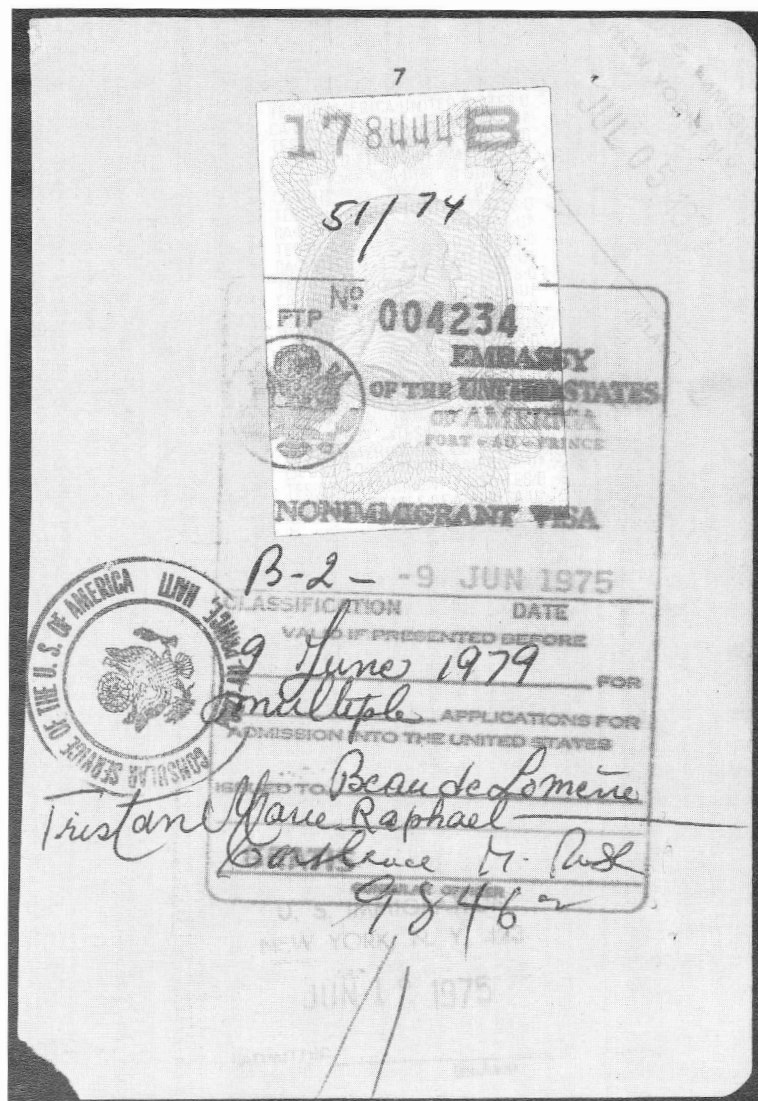
parts one and two. The issue concludes with part three of John Harper's "Tobacco company cancellation dating codes."

U.S. Consular Service counterfoil

(The item illustrated here was provided by Don Duston with additional comments from John Hotchner (who works for the Department of State Passport Office) and by Ronald Leshner.)

A page from a Haitian passport with a



nonimmigrant visa to the United States is illustrated here. The visa was granted in 1975 and was good for multiple entries into the U.S. until June 9, 1979. The back of the page indicates the holder also traveled to Peru and Argentina. The visa is stamped in multiple colors onto the page which had 38 x 56 mm self-adhesive printed sticker applied to it.

This sticker is known as a counterfoil. They were used for all nonimmigrant visas beginning in the 1970s. Several million were used each year, so they should not be scarce, but we will have to wait until expired passports turn up. The counterfoils remained in use for about ten years, but are no longer used.

They were printed by the Bureau of Engraving and Printing. The vignette of Washington is printed in pale green surrounded by a multi-colored lathwork. There is a yellow underprint consisting of the words "UNITED STATES of AMERICA" repeated over the entire stamp. The serial number at the top is in pink and appears to be a numbering scheme similar to the customs baggage labels.

The counterfoil is printed in pastel colors on glossy paper stock. The vignette consists of continuous fine lines curving so as to give the appearance of a medallion. The colors, the design and the paper stock were all designed to prevent the counterfeiting of U.S. visas. It works; the scanning process used to make the halftone for this journal has resulted in moire patterns. As a result this illustration give a rather different appearance than the original item does. The same thing would happen if the visa were copied in a color copy machine.

These counterfoils would certainly fit into a collection of Consular Service stamps.

Express stamps and labels catalog project

An all new catalog of the express stamps and labels of the United States is being planned by ARA member Bruce Mosher. It is expected to be published in 1999 which is the 160th anniversary of William Harnden's 1839 express which is generally recognized

as the first private express company in the U.S.

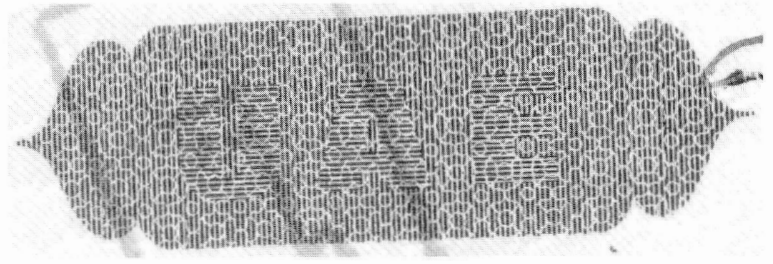
UAE visa counterfoils

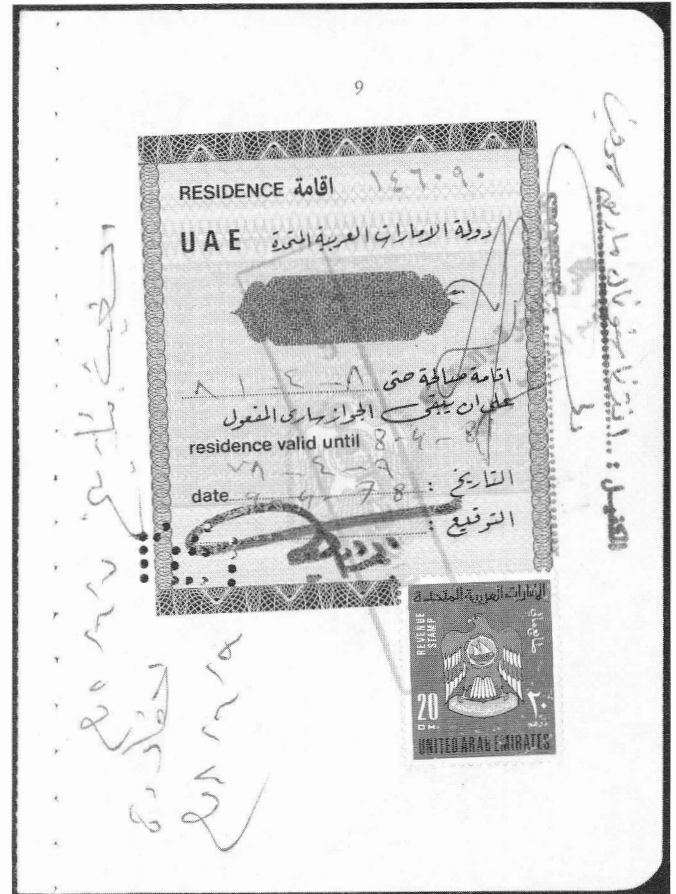
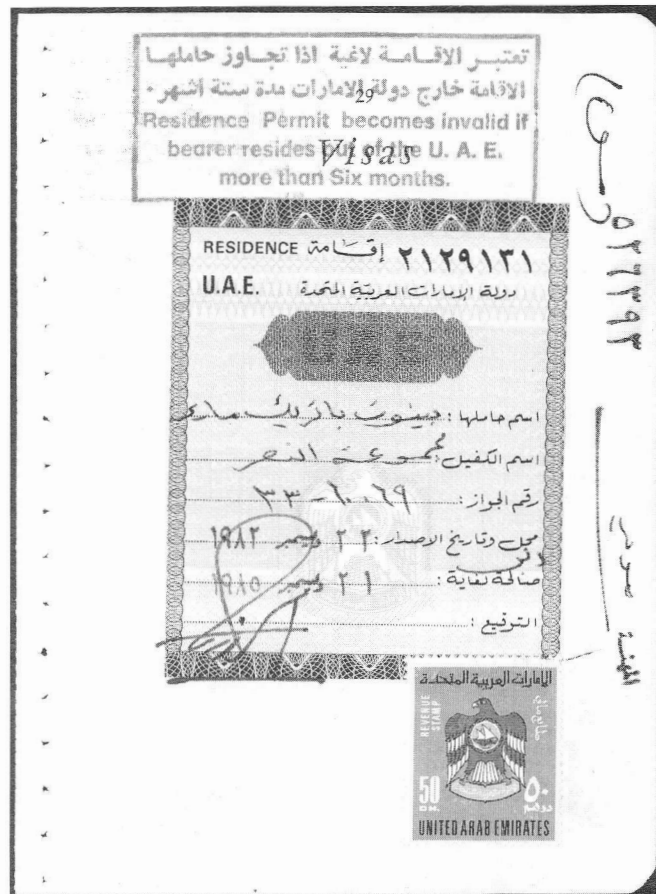
Shortly after writing the item about the U.S. Consular Service counterfoils I obtained the two items illustrated here. They are residence permits issued by the United Arab Emirates and are taken from expired French passports. The frame, text and central security tablet are printed by intaglio in dark green about the color of U.S. currency. The coat of arms is pink and the background lathe work is green (in the center) and tan (top and bottom) and appear to be printed by offset lithography. The revenue stamp is tied to the page and counterfoil/permit with an embossed seal.

It would appear as though these may have been printed by the American Bank Note Company as the security tablet is typical of their work. The letters "UAE" are hidden in variations of the engraving and are normally visible by viewing the tablet at an oblique angle from the bottom.

Since these contain text and blanks that must be filled in, they might not be considered counterfoils, but they are a security device and are used in conjunction with revenue stamps. Again, as passports expire, these items should become available to the collector.

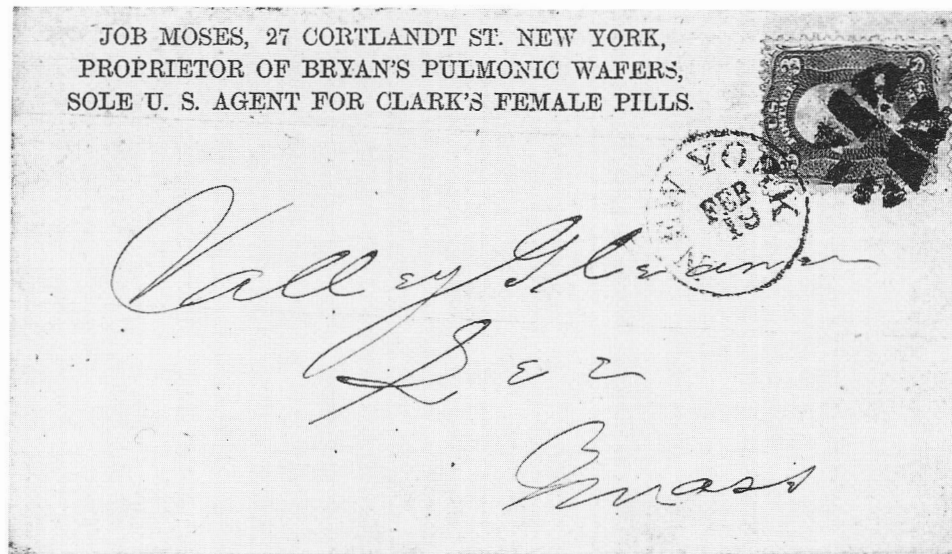

handstamped indicia rather than go to the expense of commissioning a private die. Apparently Moses was unconvinced of the promotional or security value of such a move.

One of the first references to Job Moses as a patent medicine dealer is in the Rochester, New York, city directory for 1860. He claimed to be the exclusive agent on this side of the Atlantic for Sir James Clarke's (sic) celebrated female pills. Sir James Clark (note the correct spelling) had been the personal physician to Queen

Victoria since she was the Duchess of Windsor.

There is however, no evidence that Dr. Clark ever created or marketed such a nostrum in England or anywhere else, and the so-called British tax stamp that Moses proudly displayed on the container as a certificate of authenticity was in fact only a poor facsimile of a genuine stamp. It would thus appear that Moses, like some other domestic patent medicine manufacturers, used the supposed exotic pedigree and imported nature of his own domestically produced medicine to give it a bit of a boost in this very competitive market. Whether Sir James Clark permitted or acquiesced to such advertising and sale of medicines in his name or not, and if so whether he received any remuneration therefore is unknown. In all likelihood Dr. Clark was in the dark.

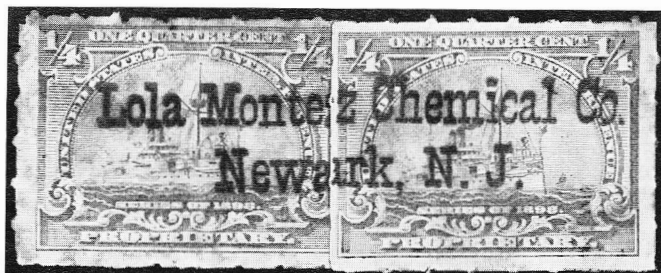


Figure 1. The rubber stamp cancel of the Lola Montez Chemical Co.

Job Moses moved to New York City and is first listed as a dealer in patent medicines in the 1865-6 Business Directory at 27 Cortlandt Street. Figure 1 shows a period cover with Moses' address and proprietary specialties, while Figure 2 illustrates a typical advertisement of the period.

In the 1866-7 edition of the *New York Business Directory* both Job Moses and Oscar

Most collectors of proprietary company cancellations on our early revenues are familiar with the delightfully biblical sounding name of Job Moses.

Moses was one of a number of highly successful patent medicine proprietors who opted to use the regular government die stamps precanceled with a distinctive

G. Moses & Company are listed at the 27 Cortlandt Street address. Exactly what their familial relationship was is unknown. Who the "& Co." of Oscar G. Moses & Co. is also unknown, but it is entirely probable that it was Job himself and possibly others. Oscar is believed to have been associated with Job in the Clark pill enterprise.

The first type of Job Moses cancellation recorded is illustrated in Figure 3; a small undated circular handstamp in black with a fancy spacer in the center on the 1¢ Proprietary

etary (Scott R3c). It is scarce, not recorded on any other stamp and was probably used only on the Bryan's Pulmonic Wafers which retailed for 25¢.

The next Moses cancels are similar in that they are both handstamped in a 5 mm high black script (Figures 4 and 5). On the First Issue they are known only on the 4¢, Proprietary (Scott R22c). The Job Moses cancel is also known on the later proprietary issues; the 2¢ and 4¢ issues of 1871 and 1875 (Scott RB1, RB2, RB11 and RB12). (Figures 6-9). The 2¢ was used to pay the tax on a 50¢ retail item and the 4¢ on a \$1 retail item. The O.G.M. & Co. cancel, however, is not known on any of the later proprietary issues. Why this is so is not known.

Job and Oscar continued to be associated somehow, but in the 1869-70 directory the address for both changes to 18 Cortlandt Street and the "& Co." is dropped from Oscar G. Moses. The address change may have been the result of a renumbering of the streets rather than an actual move. Oscar was known to have marketed other nostrums such as Dr. Charles E. Kings' Prepared Prescription in 1866 and Pulmona in 1878. Thus, Oscar was in business at least as late as that date and identifiable cancels for that period should exist.

Both Job and Oscar likely marketed other medicines in the 1860s and '1870s, Job continuing through the turn of the century as his printed precancel is well-known on the battleship proprietaries.

Does anyone have any information to add? If so, we certainly would like to hear from

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1997-98 Duck Stamp Souvenir Card

The U. S. Fish and Wildlife Service, Federal Duck Stamp Office's April 18, 1997, Bulletin announced the issuance of its eleventh version of the Federal Duck Stamp Souvenir Card. The 1997-98 stamp design, a single majestic Canada Goose standing next to a pristine lake, was created from an acrylic painting by Robert Hautman of Plymouth, Minnesota. He is the winning artist of the 1996 Federal Duck Stamp Contest.

This year's souvenir card, designed and printed by the Bureau of Engraving and Printing, has a dusky multi-hued background reminiscent of a Minnesota sunset. The serene background frames a striking picture of the newest duck stamp.

Sales from the Federal Duck Stamp Program are used to purchase and protect vital wetlands for waterfowl and several other wildlife species. Since 1934, millions of Duck Stamp dollars have contributed to preserving

about four million acres of wetland habitat in the National Wildlife Refuge System.

The Federal Duck Stamp Souvenir Card is presented in two formats, mint and post office canceled. The mint souvenir card contains the 1997-98 stamp in a separate glassine. The post office canceled card has the 1997-98 stamp adhered to it. That card also contains two 32-cent Endangered Species postage stamps with two different cancellations: The June 21, 1997, McLean, Virginia, First Day of Issue Signing Ceremony and the July 19, 1997, Minneapolis, Minnesota, Artist's Hometown Event. Both cancellations were designed exclusively by Mr. Hautman for use on the souvenir card.

The Bureau has printed the duck stamp since 1934. Bureau Engraver Thomas Hipschen completed the extensive engraving detailing the wind ruffled feathers on the goose's back.

In the past, the Bureau has offered only the mint duck stamp card sets. This year the Bureau will offer the mint duck stamp card sets as well as a limited edition of 1,000 canceled duck stamp souvenir cards. There is no limit on the purchase of the mint duck stamp card sets, however, sales are limited to three per customer of the canceled cards.

Cards may be ordered by mail using check or credit card (MasterCard or Visa) or by phone using credit card. The cost of the mint set is \$25.00 (product number 4871) and the canceled set is \$27.50 (product number 4872). A sixty year old postcard provided an answer to Washington liquor cancels

In my article "Washington state liquor cancellations on federal strip stamps" (*The American Revenuer* 1997 May; 51:130-133), I asked if any member could assist with an explanation for the inscription "U.D.L." which appeared on at least two of the illustrations. In a reaffirmation of the concept behind members helping members, ARA member Ernest Wilkens sent a photocopy of a postcard he said dated to around circa 1930, the obverse side of which is illustrated here.

Although it maybe difficult to clearly see all the print on the bottles, each carries an inscription that they were distilled and bottled by United Distillers, Limited of Vancouver, British Columbia, from whence comes the "U.D.L." notation. Notice the bold center letters on the second bottle from the right.



Mr. Wilkens went on to correctly note that the red strip stamps used on domestic liquor by control states such as Washington and others never were canceled with liquor brand names. thus, we can conclude the the group of three illustrations that appeared on page 132 of my article were of domestic origins and not imported.

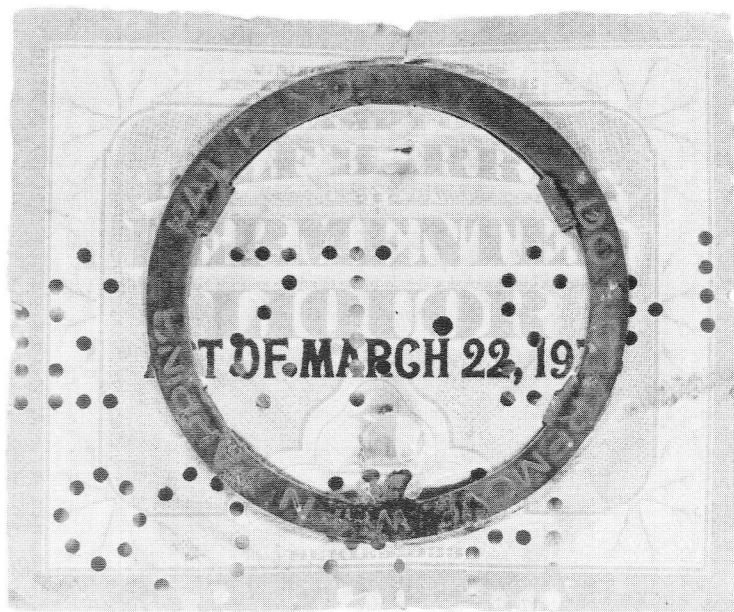


Figure 1. Metal ring with flange inscribed "PATENT PENDING" on the 1/2 barrel stamp of

I was looking over some of my holdings of the 1898 battleship proprietary stamps, again. I have looked at these stamps many times and suddenly I thought I would "write up" an interesting cancel on a rouletted 1/4¢ proprietary, Scott RB21. The 1/4¢ tax was used on products selling for about 15 cents. The cancellation shown in Figure 1 reads "Lola Montez Chemical Co. / Newark, N. J." was applied with a rubber stamp in dark blue. Since the cancel is longer than one stamp, I put two of them together to show the entire cancel.

A thorough search of the *Druggists Directory* of the period failed to show a listing of the company or their products. I also checked the book *Manufacturers of Drugs and Sundry Products* and again did not find a listing. Both books have a notation stating "Sold to Subscribers." If the Lola Montez Company was small, it probably did not subscribe to these services.

At any rate, I can surmise that products of a firm with the name Lola Montez were cosmetics in nature or a line of toiletries. The name Lola Montez would indeed be appropriate for a cosmetic line.

But who was Lola Montez?

Lola made here fame as an exotic dancer throughout Europe and the United States. Figure 2 is a photograph of her taken in 1851. Lola was born in Ireland in 1818. I doubt that Lola Montez was an Irish name but rather the name she adopted for her trade as a dancer. She was indeed a very beautiful lady, full of ambition, full of life. She had many admirers in Europe and was courtesan to the King of Bavaria who made her his mistress and bestowed to her the title of Countess of Landsfeldt.

She left Europe and arrived in San Francisco, California, in 1853. Her "Spider" dances were a sensation. In San Francisco she was ridiculed by her rivals causing her stress. She boarded a stage for Sacramento, California, where she danced. Soon there was a falling out with the theater manager. At the end of another stagecoach trip, she and her husband ended in Grass Valley, California, a mining town. Soon after their arrival she and her husband purchased a home for much needed rest. In a short time their marriage ended.

She made a dancing sojourn to Australia then returned to Grass Valley. She sold here home there and moved to New York City in 1861. In New York here health was waning and here fortune dwindled. Friendless, Lola died in New York City in 1861. She lived a full and adventurous life but was soon forgotten—alas.

When is a dog not a dog?

Answer: Only when its usage depicts a unique method of fastening a beer stamp to a hogshead, barrel, keg or other container. The law required that all stamps be affixed upon the spigot-hole or tap of said keg. Different methods of affixing stamps were used but the method to be described here is by *metal rings* or *bow ties* officially referred to as "retaining clamps." The method is seldom seen due of course to the horrible appearance of the stamp after being pierced by the metal prongs on the clamps. They were obviously considered uncollectable and promptly discarded when found. When they have appeared they have been on the 1933 and 1934 issues.

The rings came in a variety of forms having flat or rounded top flanges, four or six

prongs and even spur clips on the prongs themselves. One such metal ring is shown in Figure 1. It is on the first issue of 1933 1/2 barrel having outside and inside diameters of 48 mm and 39 mm respectively, with the wording on the top flange "DO NOT REMOVE WHEN TAPPING PAT. PEND." From the perforated initials it was apparently used by the B. B. Co. and has a cancellation date of March 12, 1934 (3•12•34).

A bow tie clamp used on a 1/2 barrel stamp of the 1933 second issue along with an Illinois stamp is shown in Figure 2. The stamp is canceled with the initials S. B. Co. and dated 3•13•34 (March 13, 1934). An identical size bow tie has been seen on the 1/4 barrel 1933 first issue with the perforated initials of the B. E. B. Co. and dated 10•27•33.

The most intriguing metal ring discovered is that pictured in Figure 3. It was used on a 1/4 barrel stamp 1934 issue. It is identical in size to the ring in Figure 1 with six prongs bent downward. The stamp is canceled with the perforated initials 12•30•37 and apparently was used by the Standard Brewing Co. The clue to this entire subject of rings and how they were affixed is in the wording on the top flange "DO NOT REMOVE WHEN TAPPING PATENT 1,982,806."

Figure 4 is the first page of the patent itself showing seven various drawings of the stamp retaining clamp. The titles of each drawing are: Fig. 1 Device installed on spout of beer container showing stamp retained by dotted lines. Fig. 2 Bottom perspective of the clamp. Fig. 3 Central vertical cross section showing beer tap connected to spout whereby the clip is forced downward. Fig. 4 Tool for removing clamp. Fig. 5&6 Modified forms of the clamp. Fig. 7 Central vertical cross section of the modified form in use.

Page two of the patent defines the objectives of the inventor as being "to provide a clamp that is adapted to retain a revenue or other stamp in place on the spout of a beer or other container. Further objects are to provide a clamp which may be stamped or punched from a single piece of metal and which may, therefore, be manufactured at comparatively small cost."

One can only surmise that these retaining clamps had a short life since the only ones recorded had been used on the 1/4 and 1/2 barrels of the 1933 and 1934 issues. Difficulty in affixing them or their cost may also have been contributing factors leading to their demise. Had these clamps been widely used on all the various sizes of beer kegs since Prohibition, the popularity of collecting beer stamps might well have suffered.

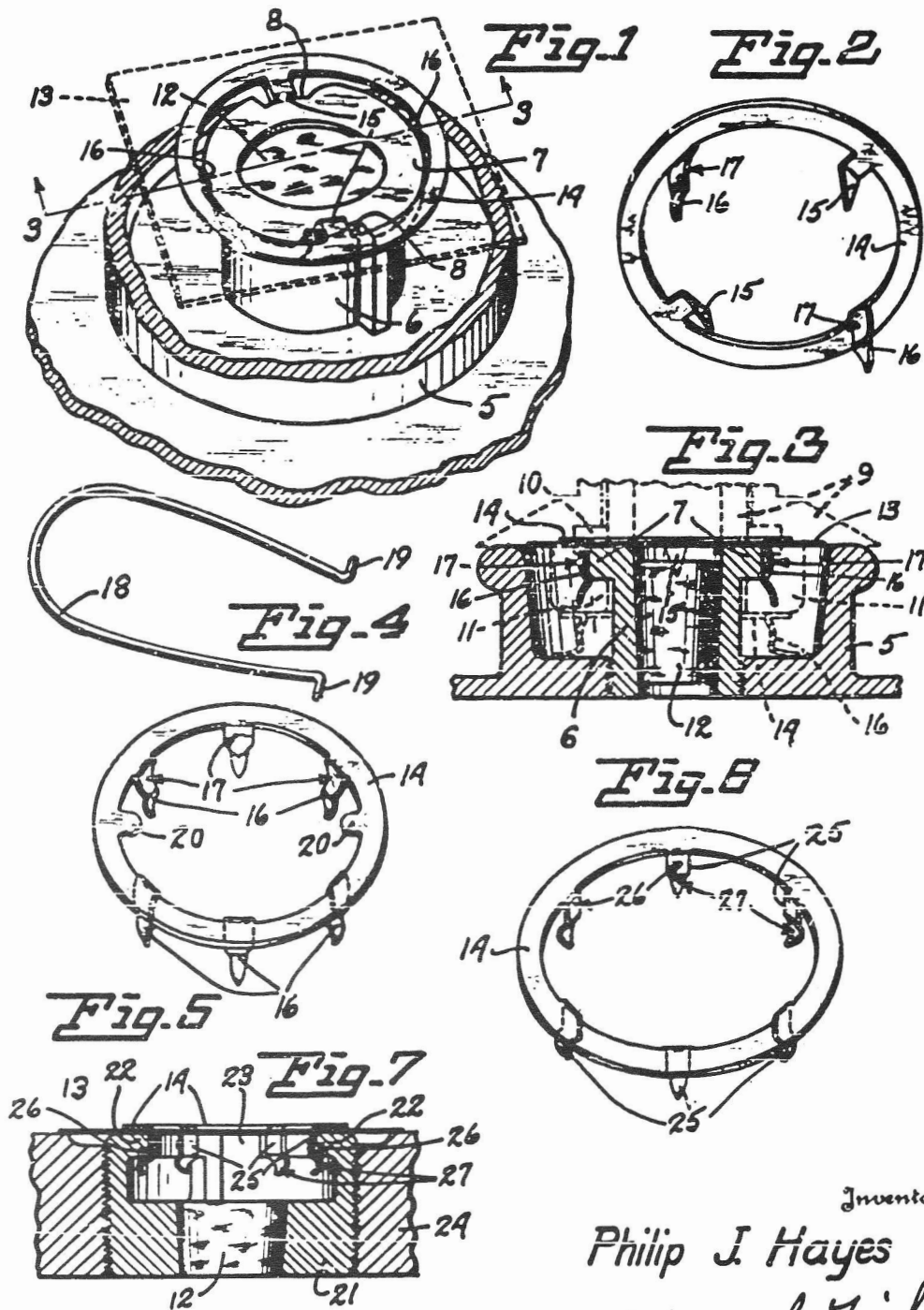

pages. No one wanted to leave as evidenced by the fact that half of the diners were still there one and a half hours after we finished desert.

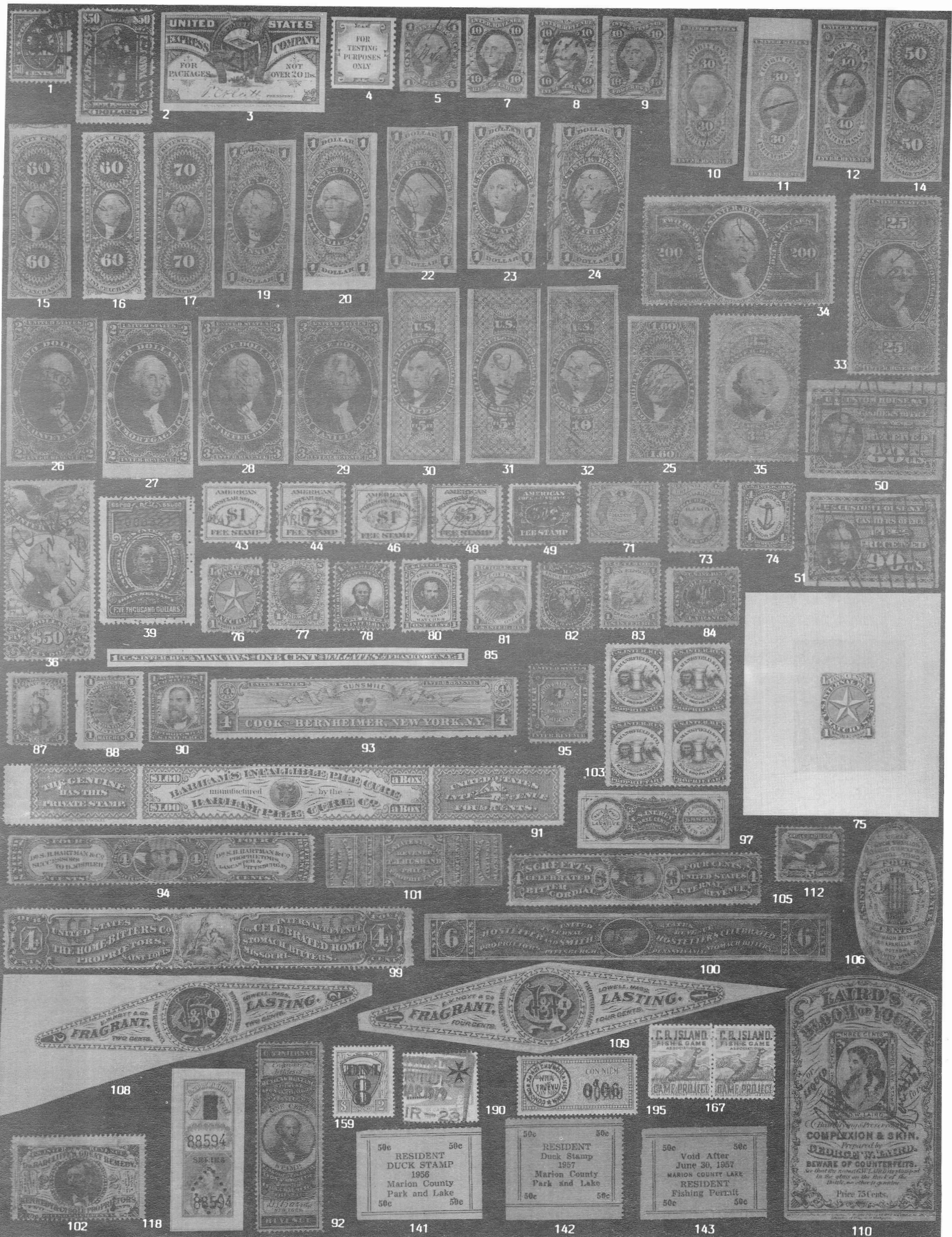

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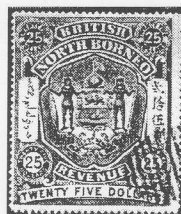
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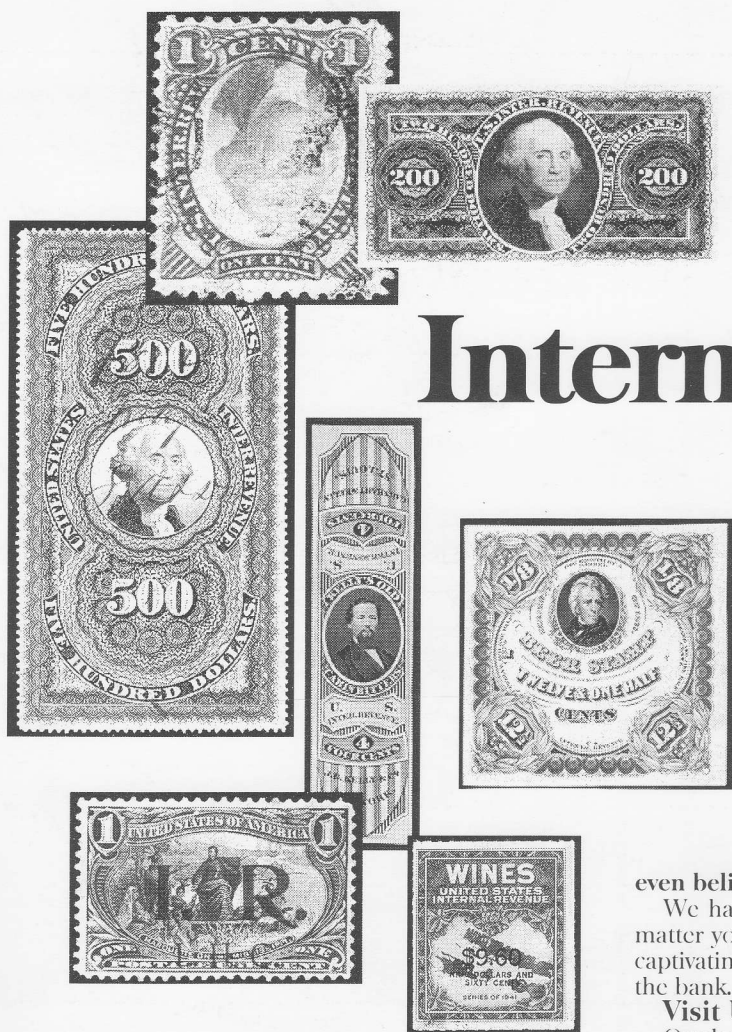
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
