the November-December (51:274-275) issue of The American Revenuer, documents related to a short lived tax on cotton were discussed. In the article it was mentioned that a red lien card existed which was placed on the cotton if the tax was not paid, and which rendered the cotton unsalable until the tax was paid.

M. E. Matesen happened to be cleaning out a closet when his issue of The American Revenuer arrived and by chance happened to have just seen the red lien card among his "items to be researched pile." It is shown



lection. On this item Mr. Seville notes these were "...used on cotton on which the grower was unwilling to pay the tax. Most of them, in need of money, paid the tax and took balance. A few refused and these red tags were placed on the cotton bale by the government. The bale could not be moved or sold until the tax was paid. With repeal [of the law] cotton was free to move with lien tag or not."

The tag itself indicates there is one small error in what Mr. Seville reported. The cotton could be moved, but only to storage. A fine of \$1,000 was imposed on anyone moving it for sale or selling it. The tag also indicates the tax rate was six cents per pound of cotton. On this particular tag the tax on a 510 pound bale comes to \$30.60.

Enclose with this item was a Certificate of Taggin Lint Cotton which was shown in the earlier article. It was from the same gin in Edwards, Mississippi, eight days earlier. What is curious is that the serial numbers are 8102495 and 12372869. A gin in Mississippi is not going to have processed four million bales in eight days, but it does indicate there were a lot of these certificates around at one time.

A Boutwell find

In an article in The American Revenuer (1997 February; 51:54-57) about Puerto Rican Boutwell stamps, Scott Troutman noted that the law that produced these stamps went into effect January 1, 1942. Therefore, I was quite surprised to find eleven stamps with dates prior to 1942. All eleven are the 60¢ brown Boutwell (Scott RE46), which was the most heavily used stamp in the set. I speculate that all these were probably used by the same company, although at least two and probably three different date cancelers were used. The dates have two sizes, denoted as large (5 mm) and small (4 mm) dates. The dates on the stamps are as follows:

JAN 23 1941	small	blue
SET 3-1941	small	blue
5- SET 1941	large	blue
SEP 25 1941	small	blue


18 OCT 1941 small violet 10 NOV 1941 large blue blue 13 NOV 1941 small (2 copies) 17 NOV 1941 violet large 12 DIC 1941 small blue 26 DIC 1941 small blue SET and DIC are common Spanish abbreviations for September and De-

Whether the 60¢ stamp was pressed into service early to fill shortages of the older 60¢ rectified spirits stamp (Scott RE29) or if these are just erroneous settings of the date stamping device may be hard to determine. The January stamp would seem to be an erroneously set handstamp, but the others may indeed have been released early.











they had the red tags as well as the metal cotton bale tags. These metal tags come in colors of yellow, gray (galvanized) and red. A yellow tag has "USIR" vertically and then "COTTON," a serial number and "1933." The gray tag has "US" vertically and "INTERNAL / REVENUE / 1933-34." The red tag is similar to the gray but with the date "1935—36."

One can see where wires came out of the square corners of the tag. Until we see one

with the wire still attached we cannot be certain but they appear to be identical to the seals still used by many utility companies on electric and gas meters. Those seals have a small loop just smaller than the tag itself. The colored tags illustrated here are painted and in good condition while the gray galvanized tag has corroded. We want to thank Herman Ivester for loaning these tags to the Editor for illustration.

Stamp duty imprints on checks

In the April 1997 issue of *The American Revenue* (51:111), Terence Hines illustrated a "STAMP DUTY PAID" imprint on a bank check from the United Kingdom. He wondered if they were still used and if similar imprints were used elsewhere. There are two main types of duty (revenue) stamps found on financial documents of the United Kingdom: Adhesive types of duty stamps, and Imprinted and/or embossed duty stamps.

The latter type includes the following: A. Colorless embossed and/or imprinted duty stamps which are ornate types of *ad valorem* duty stamps used since the latter part of the 18th century and are found on Drafts on Demand, Bills of Exchange, Promissory Notes and Receipts.

B. Oval type duty stamps of three types: a. A *clear* oval, embossed in colorless relief used for stamp duty on cheques, 1866-1880. b. A red colored oval, of three main varieties, embossed in relief and used for one penny stamp duty on cheques, 1900-1918, an English variety with rose emblem, a Scottish variety with thistle emblem and a Northern Irish variety with sharock emblem. c. From 1918-1960 the three varieties of the red one penny ovals were changed to blue two pence ovals for cheques.

C. Printed medallion types of duty stamps

used from 1957 to about 1972. There are three varieties, an English type with a Tudor crown, a Scottish type with Scottish crown and a Northern Irish type inscribed "Northern Ireland."

Checks and related documents of many other countries are found with imprinted stamp duty medallions. Most of these countries have been earlier, dominions or colonies of the British Empire.

Illustrated here is a group of checks and related documents with some examples of printed medallions and designs. These documents with their interesting revenue stamps with some of high denominations and often from more than one country, along with a trail of banking and identification endorsements, sometimes with thumbprint impressions and in strange scripts on both face and back, are original examples of financial history. Each check and related document is different from any other in some detail, so any collection of any number is technically unique.

The collector of world revenue stamps will find that having some checks and other documents bearing revenue stamps, instead of a single stamp in an album, will "tell the rest of the story" and provide some fascinating armchair adventures and novel additions to their collection.




U. K.: English printed medallion with Tudor crown.







Duck Tracks—1st quarter 1998

The combined fourth quarter 1997-first quarter 1998 issue of *Duck Tracks* leads with a report about the 1997 federal duck stamp contest by Robert Lesino, the Federal Duck Stamp Office Program Manager. Bob Dumaine provides a feature about Robert Steiner whose artwork won the contest. Nick Oglesby provides us with a look at the Delaware 1998 stamp and the contest that picked its design.

Oglesby also provides some insight into how duck stamps often acquired socked on the nose postal cancels while Tom DeLuca looks into why a number of states have issued stamps for the same year with different denominations. The issue closes with the National Duck Stamp Collector Society's fourth annual duck stamp poll. Members are asked to vote for their favorite design, the best design and the worst design among the duck stamps issued by the various U.S. states in 1997.

The Revenue Journal of Great Britain—March 1998

In the March 1998 issue of *The Revenue Journal of Great Britain* Steven Zirinsky presents a look at the "Revenue Stamps of Tonga." These are postage stamps (often ten years old) overprinted "STAMP / DUTY" or "STAMP / DUTY / ONLY" and are sometimes

found postally used. These stamps are illustrated and cataloged. Portions of a letter from the International Coffee Organisation discusses the stamps often seen from this organization and describes how they were to be used. Alan D. Anyon writes about "Colom

bia—foreign Service Revenuers" in an article that presents a preliminary listing of these stamps.

Short articles and the editor's extensive "Notes & Queries" section provide information or seek information about a wide area of subjects including revenues from India, Argentina, Spanish Philippines, United States of America, Brazil, Colombia, British Guiana and Switzerland as well as information about various related subjects such as binding the *Journal* and literature searches. Addition-

ally, one must not forget Editor Clive Akerman's excellent reviews and editorial commentary.

Literature in review

Bosnien-Herzegovina: revenue stamped papers and revenue stamps by (Martin) Erler, (Miodrag) Mrdja and Tkalcsics (no ISBN). 80 pages, A5, perfect bound card, covers, priced, illustrated, bilingual (German/English). Published by ORA-Verlag, (Irschenhauserstrasse 5, Icking, D-82055 Germany). Available from the publisher and should be available later in the U.S. from Eric Jackson and other literature dealers.

The purpose of this catalog is to update the 1929 listing by Mayr-Hanus and the 1968 listing by Spajic. It includes newly discovered items and brings prices more in line with the current market. The scope of the listings are limited to the period of Austrian Administration and the period of time when the area was officially incorporated into the Austrian

Empire (1877-1918).

However, it is still somewhat of a basic listing. Major color varieties are given for many issues but Erler acknowledges that many more probably exist. The various known perforation varieties for the early documentary issues are indicated by Xs on a graph-chart and are not distinguished by color variety or by price.

There are a number of issues, notably the early Turkish stamped revenue paper and the tobacco adhesives that are not priced. These are really preliminary listings made with the anticipation that the ranks of the items listed will be filled in by reports of discoveries from others and that a market will develop so that the items can be priced.

Scott 1999 Standard Postage Stamp Catalogue, Volume 1, James E. Kloetzel, Editor (ISBN 0-89487-240-0). 894 + 46A pages, 8 1/4 x 11 inches, perfect bound, card covers, priced, illustrated. Published by Scott Publishing Co, 911 Vandemark Rd, Sidney, OH 45365-0828. List price \$36.00, available from many stamp and literature dealers.

Volume 1 of the 1999 Scott Catalogue is now available. Coverage includes the Unites States, the United Nations and the world beginning with the letters A and B. The United States listings include documentary revenues, proprietary stamps, future delivery stamps, stock transfer stamps and hunting permit stamps better known as duck stamps.

The last category now prices RW1-RW12 mint hinged and unhinged and all the

stamps with no gum. Scott's publisher Stuart Morrissey indicates that in most instances these no gum stamps are used stamps that were not signed and have been removed from licenses. They have been widely used for framing and are becoming popular with cost conscious collectors.

An example of the new pricing for RW1 is \$675 mint unhinged, \$350 hinged, \$160 no gum and \$115 used. This definitely shows the high value collectors place on 65 year old dextrin.

The listings are limited for a revenue only collector although they are about 6 months later than the last U.S. Specialized, the next one of which is due in October.

The Penny Post—January 1998

The January 1998 issue of *The Penny Post* presents two studies of local post forgeries. The first by Steven Roth and Carl Kane looks at the issues from and purported to be from Baltimore. They give detailed descriptions of the Davis Penny Post cinderellas, Grafflin's Despatch, Stringer & Morton's Despatch, Wiley's Despatch and the carrier stamps issued by the Baltimore postmasters. Both genuine and forgeries are examined. The second major study is by Larry Lyons. Lyons examines the originals and the forgeries of Wells Fargo & Co. Both articles list identifying characteristics found on the genuine stamps and each of the forgeries which are

identified by the forger if known.

Also in this issue is "The Springside Stamp" which seems to be the original stamp on which Samuel Allan Taylor based his Springside Post Office local in 1864. "Confessions of a Philatelic Sucker" is the confession letter from 1936 which tells how a collector obtained three local covers which proved to be fakes.

Brighton & Hove '98 National Stamp Exhibition

The Association of British Philatelic Societies will sponsor a national level stamp exhibition November 21-22, 1998, to be held at the Hove Town Hall. This show is broken into several sections which include thematics, revenues, cinderellas, literature and an interfederation competition that includes traditional philately, postal history and aerophilately. U. S. Sales Circuit Notes

The U.S. sales circuit is approaching a milestone. Sales book number 500 will soon be assigned. These nearly 500 salesbooks represent the property of 38 different owners. One member has submitted eighty of these books.

This points to the fact that a tiny percentage of ARAers are providing the circuit with the bulk of new material. So, to introduce the circuit program to potential contributors of sales material, I am hereby offering one free blank salesbook to every member who requests one. Simply send me a postal card, specifying which format you want — 1, 4, 6, 9 or 12 spaces per page — and I will mail you your complimentary salesbook postpaid. The 8 1/2" x 11" oversize salesbooks are included in this free offer. Request yours soon; this offer expires July 1.

It is usually better to mount material of a like nature in a salesbook. For instance, sales would be improved if consular fees stamps were not mixed with wine stamps. However, in conjunction with this free offer, I am instituting on a trial basis a new category: All Revs. Anything U.S. related will be allowed to be mounted in these salesbooks: a few customs fees stamps, a handful of M&Ms, a couple of pages of state revenues. So if you are interested in receiving anything and everything in the way of U.S. revenues, drop

me a line, and I will add you to this new category. We'll see what happens.

As an incentive to potential circuit participants, and as a small thank you to present circuit users, I am also reducing the \$1.50 insurance fund fee to one dollar, effective immediately. All currently circulating circuits are included. Just line out the preprinted "\$1.50" and enter "\$1.00." As a reminder, the insurance fund fee helps pay the cost of our private insurance protecting the circuit contents. It is payable even though no purchases are made.

In closing, these categories are in particular demand: battleships and battleship cancellations, wines, playing cards, tobacco, narcotics, consular service, liquor strips, taxpaids, and miscellaneous revenue material.

Overstocked material includes the reds and greens, and state fish and game revenues. Please refrain from sending quantities of these at this time.

I feel confident you will see the merits of insuring through the program endorsed by the ARA.

This was a very strong showing for revenues at two recent shows, a total of seven entries with four gold and three vermeil show medals and a grand award in addition. Congratulations to all and we all look forward to seeing a revenue exhibit in the Champion of Champions exhibition in August. This will be two years in a row that there will have been a revenue exhibit in that competition. Donald Green's private die medicine exhibit was in the Champion of Champions last year.

Alfred F. Lichtenstein Award to Gary S. Ryan

The Collector's Club of New York has announced that the 1998 recipient of the coveted Alfred F. Lichtenstein Memorial Award is Gary S. Ryan. He was cited for his outstanding achievement in five areas of exhibiting and for his writing. 
